Dunedin has a proud track record of community-led innovation to address complex challenges and foster caring, resilient communities.

It's well recognised that to solve complicated problems, we must be adaptable, focus on strengths, think holistically and support participation. Integrating these approaches with indigenous values and authentic community relationships boosts the potential for positive change. However, working in these new ways with a broad range of partners is not straightforward. New skillsets and tools are required.

Two frameworks — collective impact (CI) and community-led development (CLD) — offer flexible and practical guidance for those working to make change.

This workshop will help change makers from diverse sectors (the community, government, funding, iwi/hapū and business):

- deepen their knowledge of community engagement, human-centred design and collective impact practices
- identify barriers and opportunities for community-led and cross-sectoral work to advance wellbeing in Dunedin
- identify new tools and strategies to apply these practices/approaches in your role(s).

Participants will learn how to:

- engage community members to identify barriers and create bold visions
- effectively engage diverse audiences and sustain that engagement
- spark and support creative, community-led approaches
- harness shared leadership, with organisational and community perspectives working together to create change
- work with the community to test new approaches.
