Perseverance has and will be rewarded, and you have also shown that challenges are there to overcome not give up at. Of course, some did not rise to the challenge and lost their way, but failure is a lesson as well and we hope students can learn from that.

Any students who are attending tutorials over the next couple of weeks will already know when these are. Please be aware that senior staff will be involved in Year 10 camp and relief cover during exam times, so do not just drop in and expect to be able to see a teacher. Requests for study assistance would need to be done in advance.

Year 10 head off to camp at Windy Point on Tuesday where Mr Cate and his team have a great programme organised for the three days so hopefully the weather is not as unpredictable as this week!

Year 9 will be business as usual up until the end of term and our expectation is that they will stay focussed and not squander learning opportunities for themselves or others. HOW TO GET A JOB

There is no iron-clad way to secure yourself a job if you are in the 18-24 age bracket, but these suggestions are a good starting point.

- Make sure your CV is up to date. High school extracurricular activities look good and can show employability skills even if you do not have work experience
- · Practice your interview skills with family and friends

- Take work experience if offered, have a positive attitude, and turn up punctually every day
- Show enthusiasm and initiative and be prepared to do the dull jobs first
- Link up with organisations working with young people in your area
- Learning is lifelong no-one knows it all so be willing to take instruction and guidance
- CV drop, walk into premises and tell employers that you are keen to work and that you are looking for work
- Remember, you do not have to commit to a job forever, so give things a go.







