GOD'S WAYS ARE DIFFERENT

On this Sunday, justice is the whole point of the parable and of Jesus' teaching. We have to learn what God's justice is like. Another name used for God's justice is mercy and compassion. In the eyes of the world it can sometimes seem very unjust. In the gospel parable, the point being made is not that the longer workers got less than what was their due but that the later workers got exactly the same treatment from their master.

Things are not being measured according to individual output but according to need. All, early or late, have exactly the same need for God's mercy and God's love and everyone gets all of it. So, rather than criticising God for acting this way, we should be deeply grateful for what we receive.

The parable is an extraordinary example of what is known as Ignatian "indifference", that is, the perfect acceptance of what God wants, the perfect acceptance of God's ways and the total merging of my vision with His. And this is done actively, not passively. Let us ask him that we may have the same level of freedom and generosity in our own lives.
