Guided tour of Timaru District Council's recycling facilities at Redruth.

Event 1. Friday 7 Sept, afternoon.

- Visit the public drop-off facility, hear about a current re-design project, then go behind the scenes to see:
- the Materials Recovery Facility (what happens to the TDC yellow-lid wheelie bin contents);
- wood, going to the pyrolysis plant, which makes charcoal;
- the composting site for bulk garden prunings and green-lid bin contents;
- the managed landfill cells (contents of red-lid bin and on-street bins);
- site preparation work and building designs for EcoCentre Timaru (SSCT);
- then find bargains at the Crow's Nest reuse shop (which is managed by Sustainable South Canterbury Trust).

Tour guides will be Briony Woodnorth from TDC, Brian Gallagher and other trustees from SSCT.

Our chartered Ritchie's Coach departs railway station in central Timaru 1pm, and will stop in Shaw Street 1.15pm (where on-street parking is available. No car parking or pedestrian access on site), then take in the tour group. Information about the Sustainable South Canterbury Trust will available on the coach. \$10 to meet expenses.






Double bill - Two sustainability documentary films, on the big screen

Materials and equipment list suggestions from the tutor -

- An older or 'new but boring' jacket, skirt or sweatshirt that needs jazzing up it must already fit, as we do not have time to do shape alterations. If shopping for used clothes locally, try Red Cross Geraldine in Talbot Street, Rosie's in Peel Street Geraldine or The Crow's Nest off Shaw Street, Timaru (open Thurs-Sun).
- Sewing machine and /or an overlocker, plus power extension cord
- Dressmaking Scissors (sharp), optional rotary cutter and cutting board
- Assortment of good quality sewing threads
- Assortment of trimmings, buttons, pieces of leftover fabrics maybe share some?
- Ensure you have a fresh needle in your machine and a spare. Depending on the thickness of fabric you may require #80's or #90's; Also hnd-sewing needles, and pins
- Tailor's chalk or dressmaking fabric marker; any other sewing tools you love, to bring along and use
- Creative ideas and questions
