Homework and Bookbags:

Once classroom routines have been established your child will be regularly bringing home a book to read and spelling words to practise. Reminders

As we often have meetings before school and are preparing for the day, please do not drop your children off before 8:30am. If your child is late they need to get a late slip from the office before coming into class. If you need to collect your child early, please see Karen in the office for a sign out slip before coming to the classroom. The teacher needs to see this before they can dismiss your child.

<u>Brain Food</u> is a short break every morning. Please make sure that large pieces of fruit are cut into bite size pieces so your child is able to eat their snack in the time given. Children are encouraged to drink water throughout the day. Please send only water with your child and not milk based drinks, juice or fizzy drinks.


As we are an Enviro School, we promote <u>litterless lunches</u>. Please try to avoid plastic wrappers/packaging as much as possible.
