CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

At the beginning of term 2 we had one of our call back days for the curriculum refresh. The day was facilitated by Riripeti Totoro who is a lead for curriculum at the Ministry of Education. We looked at the new histories curriculum and how we will implement it into our kura. This year the focus is on the new language of the document and understanding how what we are already doing fits into the curriculum area; social sciences. Here at our Kura we are so fortunate that we have been a lot of this mahi in previous years so as a development team it is a matter of working with what we have and weaving it through the new curriculum. Our next MOE Teacher Only Day is Tuesday 24 October, the day after Labour Day.

STUDENT PROGRAMMES

Te Hononga Term 2 2023 - Bush Jitsu Whangarei (Jiu Jitsu) offered a year's free training/teaching and training gear to one lucky student from any local School. Matua Tai alongside Saiviah completed the application form, Matua Tai wrote a letter of support for Saivaih, who was the successful student out of the many who had applied. Both Saivaih and his whānau appreciate what this opportunity means, and have made the commitment to fully support their son. The students are enjoying the fitness programme that Matua Tai has developed for them, learning to be healthy, and take care of their bodies. They spend time in the gym, and are now playing sports during the school breaks.

Te Ora Hou Term 2 2023 - The Te Ora Hou Programme started Tuesday 9 March with 16 very excited students. The students are collected every Tuesday morning at 9am and are returned to school at 11.30am. The students have all agreed that to be part of this programme they must follow school wide expectations at all

times, representing themselves, their whānau and their community. This year we have selected students from all whānau across the school. This is beneficial for all, as they get to interact with others that they may not otherwise.

The Salvation Army's Aspire Programme - Aspire is a year long project to strengthen vulnerable young people and their families across NZ through a comprehensive program of personal development. There are 15 spaces made up of 12 participants with 3 on the waiting list. Objectives are to provide a support system and opportunities for young people to grow with a healthy world view, strong resilience skills and an ability to set goals. Engage and support families to understand and participate positively in their young people's lives. Facilitate young people to contribute back to their communities and networks including their schools.

CULTURE COUNTS:RELATIONSHIP BASED LEARNING -PROFESSIONAL GROWTH CYCLE

Last week we had seven of our kaiako training to become impact coaches. This will support our coaches in all our whānau. The goal is to work towards more of a buddy system and taking some of the pressure off our whānau leaders. This term we also have our first round of observations for 2023 using IRIS. Kaiako will be using previous goals set in term 1 to reflect on their practices around the Relationship Based Learning programme.

SCHOOL POLICIES

The BOT approved the 'Minimising Physical Restraint policy' as produced by Schooldocs and modified for our school. Please find this policy attached for your information.

FINANCE

The school is in a good financial position with money available for building and property development projects. The BOT also funds student support a lot more than the allocation that is available in the operation grant. We are still awaiting audit visit; however auditors have started review of draft accounts and raising queries by email. As annual accounts should be completed by 31. We should expect a visit any time up to that date.

PROPERTY

The school property is being maintained beautifully by Anthony Barber and his part time help, Mike Butler under the leadership of Paul Botica, with thanks.
