431 pages, best suited to Years 11-13.




Otherworld is the place where all your dreams will come true. Simon thought it was a game, but it's not – it's the next stage of reality, and it's going to change humanity.

352 pages, fun and light, suitable for any age.





304 pages, best suited to Years 11-13.





319 pages, best suited to Years 9-11.



When Peter's parents are killed during the war, he is sent to an orphanage where the Germans decide he is racially valuable. He is adopted by an important family, but Peter doesn't want to be a Nazi, so he takes a big risk...

292 pages, best suited to Years 9-11.



The Spine Shivers series are very quick and easy reads aimed at the reluctant or struggling reader, and are light horror stories. We have A Grin in the Dark and Sasquatch Island.

Around 100 pages, suitable for Years 9-10.



10 years ago, a horrific event drove the residents of Indigo Falls underground. Now a handful of families inhabit the bunker, led by Doctor Moran. He has many rules, but the most important is that you can never go outside...

336 pages, suitable for any age.



In this highly rated book set in Romania in 1989, Cristian is blackmailed by the secret police to become an informer. He has two choices – betray all those he loves and what he believes in, or undermine the most evil dictator in Eastern Europe. He joins the revolution, but what price will freedom have?

321 pages, suitable for any age, good for personal responses.



In this high fantasy novel, Prince Yarvi is determined to reclaim his throne – but first, he has to survive. Seen as a weakling because of a physical deformity, he gathers together a band of unlikely allies as he prepares to take back what is his.

416 pages, suitable for any age.



This collection features more than 20 stories and poems written by members of the American Horror Association. With stories ranging from confronting personal demons and fears to ghost stories, these stories suit readers who like their books scary...

498 pages, best suited to Years 11-13.



Set in the final days before the Armistice of WWI, this story follows three young men of different nationalities as their destinies converge. Who will live and who will die before the day ends?

206 pages, best suited to Years 9-10.



After a sea kayaking accident, Tom finds himself alone in the Alaskan wilderness. With only a small survival kit, he must find his father and reach safety...

192 pages, best suited to Years 9-10.




Michael is a member of Hitler Youth, but he has a secret – he and his parents are spies. When he finds out about a secret Nazi war mission, he must risk everything for the cause.

320 pages, best suited to Years 9-10.

320 pages, suitable for any age.



A football accident leaves Tommy in a coma, leaving friends and family to try to work out what actually happened. This book is told in a really unusual format, with articles, transcripts, Tommy's inner thoughts and texts.

In this thriller, a girl is dropped onto a tropical island with 19 other teens to compete for one million dollars and rumoured lost treasure. However, the treasure is rumoured to be cursed, and the contestants on this reality TV show cannot be trusted...

352 pages, suitable for any age.



The war has just ended, and Berlin is in ruins. Otto and his friends live in the bombed-out city, and even though the war is over, threats are everywhere. Can they survive rival gangs, invading armies and a Nazi war criminal who seems to be stalking them?

288 pages, best suited for Years 9-10.



Welcome to the future, where citizens can watch infamous criminals executed from a live streaming app. When Dee is wrongfully placed in prison, she knows she could be next. With a bunch of other prisoners, she needs to prove her innocence before it's too late. We also have the next two in this series.



368 pages, suitable for any age.




This is a younger readers edition of Thurston's best-selling autobiography, where he explains how he defied the odds to become one of the game's greatest players.
