DESCRIPTION OF COVID STAGES AT OUR SCHOOL

<p>GOVERNMENT PHASES</p>	<p>PHASE ONE There are some cases in the community but we continue to stamp it out.</p>	<p>PHASE TWO Cases have spread in the community so we need to minimise and slow further spread and assist our vulnerable communities.</p> <p>PHASE THREE There are thousands of cases per day. Most people will self-manage and health & social services will focus on families and communities with the highest needs.</p>		
<p>PREBBLETON SCHOOL STAGES</p>	<p>STAGE ONE School is open to all students.</p>	<p>STAGE TWO Hybrid model of school-based learning, and home-based learning for those who need to stay home.</p>	<p>STAGE THREE School is open for home-based learning only. Some school-based supervision may be available, depending on teaching staff availability.</p>	<p>STAGE FOUR School is closed. We don't have enough staff to open or operate home-based online learning. This is likely to be short-term.</p>
<p>WHAT THIS MEANS FOR LEARNERS</p>	<p>Almost all students are learning at school. A few students are isolating at home. Home-based learning is provided for them.</p>	<p>The majority of learners are on-site at school, however an increasing number may be at home self-isolating or unwell. Home-based learning is provided with some teacher support, as available.</p>	<p>Most students are at home. Home based learning is provided, with teacher support as available. Supervision may be available on-site for students who need to be at school.</p>	<p>All students are at home; widespread illness with students, families, and staff. Home-based learning for those who are able is largely unmonitored.</p>
<p>WHAT THIS MEANS FOR STAFF</p>	<p>Almost all staff are onsite delivering learning at school. Teachers prepare home-based learning content, as needed.</p>	<p>Some staff are absent due to illness or isolation, affecting teams. Relievers assigned to each team will be used, as available, to cover classes. Teacher Aides and Admin staff are onsite if well, and will keep in their assigned teams.</p>	<p>An increasing number of staff are unwell or isolating at home. A small number of staff are able to remain onsite to supervise any children who need to be at school. Teachers who are isolating and well; will deliver the home-based learning programmes.</p>	<p>Most or all of the staff are ill or isolating at home. Any teachers who are isolating and well; will monitor and support the home-based learning programmes as best as possible.</p>
