- The Flower Show Committee will take all care but will not accept liability for the loss of entries or part thereof.
- Judge's decision, is final. Certificates and cups awarded at Judges discretion.

HELPFUL HINTS FOR NEWCOMERS

- To clarify your daffodil, see the guide on page **6**. If you are not sure of a cut bloom class, enter the likely class and ask the stewards at set up time. They are here to help.
- Cut flower definitions:
 - Bloom one open flower
 - Stem several blooms on a stem including buds
 - *Spike* a long central stem with flowers coming out from various parts, eq gladioli
 - Cluster a group of florets at the top of a single stem, eg hydrangea Spray a stem with laterals bearing flowers, eg fuchsia
- If you are not sure if a flower will last or be ready on the day, please enter and cancel, if necessary, at venue.
- For daffodils, use moss or newspaper to keep flower upright.
- Vases are provided.
- If entering the produce and baking sections, ensure the items are of a uniform size, eg biscuits or fruit are the same size.
- Read the instructions for each section, eg preserves must be labelled.
- Allow yourself plenty of time to set up your exhibits the venue is open from 5.00-9.30pm Friday 30th September and from 8.00-9.45am on Saturday 1st October.
- Public viewing is from 1.00-4.00pm.
- Everyone from the community is invited to enter exhibits in the show. There are no charges for entries.

Identifying your Daffodil - DAFFODIL CLASSIFICATIONS

Division 1 - Trumpet Daffodils of Garden Origin

One flower to a stem, corona (trumpet or cup) as long as or longer than the perianth segments (petals).



Division 2 - Large Cup Daffodils of Garden Origin

One flower to a stem, corona (cup) more than one third but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments (petals).



Division 3 - Small Cupped Daffodils of Garden Origin

One flower to a stem, corona (cup) not more than one third the height of the perianth segments (petals).



Division 4 - Double Daffodils of Garden Origin

One or more flowers per stem with doubling of the perianth segments or the corona or both.



Division 5 - Triandrus Daffodils of Garden Origin

Usually more than one flower to a stem, head drooping, perianth segments often reflexed and of silky texture.



Division 6 - Cyclamineus Daffodils of Garden Origin

One flower to a stem, perianth significantly reflexed and corona straight and narrow. Flower at an acute angle to the stem, with a very short neck



Division 7 - Jonquilla Daffodils of Garden Origin

Usually one to three flower heads to a stout stem, leaves narrow dark green perianth segments spreading not reflexed flowers usually fragrant.



Division 8 - Tazetta Daffodils of Garden Origin

Usually three to twenty flowers to a stout stem, leaves broad perianth segments spreading not reflexed sweet scented.



Division 9 - Poeticus Daffodils of Garden Origin

Usually one flower to a stem. Perianth segments pure white corona usually disc shaped with green or yellow centre and a red rim. Fragrant.



Division 10 - Bulbocodium Hybrids

Small flowers resemble a "hoop petticoat" form.



Division 11 - Split Corona Daffodils of Garden Origin

Corona split rather than lobed and usually for more than half of its length.



Division 12 - Other Cultivars Daffodils not falling into any of the previous categories

Division ${f 13}$ - Species - All species and reputedly wild forms.
