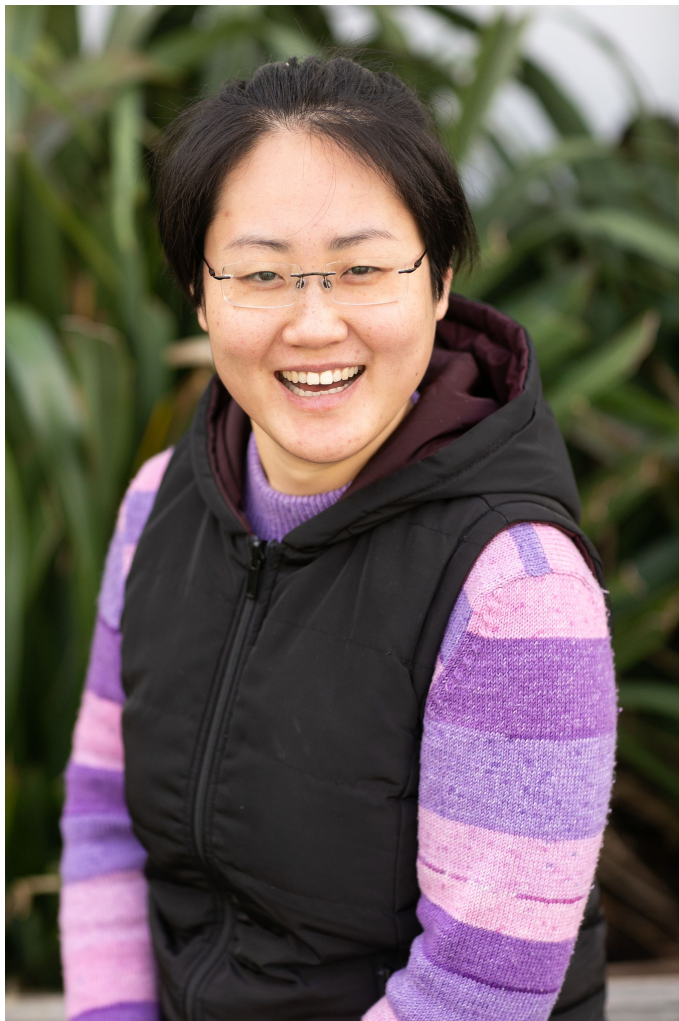

myTime


This will be time for students to explore an area where they can have a unique contribution to the world/community. There will be a project for this.
