We have also appreciated the community taking on our recommendation of children wearing a '**RASH TOP**' during their swimming sessions at Elmwood Normal School. We would appreciate your continued support. Therefore could you please check that your child has packed their Rash Top with the rest of their swimming gear.

As we are all aware, overexposure to solar ultraviolet (UV) radiation is a considerable public health concern in NZ. New Zealand has among the highest melanoma rates in the world. Melanoma is one form of skin cancer. Excessive exposure to ultraviolet radiation (UVR) from the sun causes sunburn, skin damage and increases the risk of skin cancer. Getting sunburnt in childhood and adolescence will increase the risk of melanoma and other skin cancers in later life.
