Dear Parents/Caregivers and Whānau

Term 4 is racing away with many events already completed. Athletics has been a main feature with our school sports, and then last week the zone competition. We had some great results in both the track and field events. Our choir had a wonderful experience at the Music Festival and our annual Surf to Turf event for Year 7/8 students was another highlight. Over the weekend our three Jump Jam teams competed in the Regionals.

All of these experiences create long lasting memories for our tamariki. A huge thanks to the staff and parents who support the children both in preparation for the events and on the day. It really is a team effort!

The term ahead involves planning for end of year events, report writing and preparations for 2023. After the disruptions of the year, we hope to have a smooth path to the end of the term.

The City Council have begun work on getting the pool ready for use. There is quite a lot of repair work required due to vandalism and some general wear and tear. We will be hiring keys for the summer once the pool is ready for use. We will notify you when you can purchase keys from the School Office.

NZEI Paid Union Meeting:

The NZEI has called a paid union meeting for all primary teachers who are union members. This is the majority of our teaching staff and so unfortunately we will need to finish school at the earlier time of 12.30 p.m. on Friday, 18 November 2022, so staff can attend. We have tried to choose the least disruptive meeting time to attend.

Updating Medical Information:

When students enrol at school we have parents/caregivers complete a form that gives the details of children's medical conditions. If anything changes with your child's medical needs, please request and complete a medical form from the School Office. Once this signed form is return to school the information is added to the child's file in our student management system.



This enables us to keep everything up to date.

Returning School Resources:

End of year tasks include stock takes of our resources - reading books, library books and sports uniforms. The cost of all these resources is significant and we need to ensure all our resources are accounted for. Please check at home for any school resources and have your child return them to their teacher, the library or sports uniforms to Donna in the School Office.

Chromebooks to Support ILearning:

Five years ago we began our work as part of the Manaiakalani Outreach program using digital technology to support our students' learning. The Cybersmart Curriculum and advantages of using devices has enabled our students to develop a wide range of skills, and to become digitally competent, confident and responsible. As a school we committed significant funding to lease Chromebooks to establish this programme and provide children with individual access to devices. Over time the number of student-owned devices has increased and provided even greater advantages for learning. We saw how beneficial this was during the lockdowns for home learning programmes.

Leasing large numbers of Chromebooks is not sustainable and when leases expire at the end of this year, we do not plan to renew them. We are now at a stage where we need to move to students owning their own Chromebooks. For 2023 we will be adding Chromebooks to the stationery lists for children in Years 4-8. We recommend, but will not require, children in Year 3 to own a Chromebook. There are options for purchasing a Chromebook through the Manaiakalani Trust – https://www.urumanuka.org.nz/buy-a-chromebook or local suppliers.

We encourage you to start thinking about this now and investigate the options provided by the Trust. Please talk with us about how this impacts your family if it will be difficult to achieve.

Chromebook Purchase Information:

Uru Manuka Education Trust have advised that the Purchase Bundle includes:

- 1. Acer C734 Chromebook
- 2. 3 year manufacturer's warranty
- 3. **Bag**: Targus education work-in clamshell with 3 year manufacturer's warranty
- 4. Your Chromebook comes with cover for the costs of repair and/or replacement of devices, accidentally lost and damaged associated to an **Acer Device Care Programme.** This is not an insurance product, it is an incident repair service offered with Acer Chromebook devices for the Manaiakalani Education Trust.
- 5. Cost: \$550.00 incl. GST

Road Patrol:

Senior Campus Building Progress:

To date over \$1million of work has been completed on the foundation work for the senior campus. Much of the work is underground with piles up to 18m deep. Work is progressing at the expected rate. Materials for the next stage have been ordered and the contractors are confident there will be minimal delays. These images show the exterior colour scheme that has been selected to blend in with the environment and aligned with the cultural narrative of the land. In early times this was a mahinga kai area (food gathering site) rich with birds and tuna (eels) for Māori living at Kaiapoi. The waterways were used for travel and transporting food to other areas. Planning for the interior colour schemes is the next stage.















Absences:



If your child is going to be absent from school, can you please let the school Office know by either leaving a message on the answerphone - 323 8849 option 1, send a text to 027 6364254, or by email to absences@belfast.school.nz Please state your child's name, room number and reason why they will be absent. Thank you.

Drop Off and Pick Up:

Children are able to enter their classrooms from 8:30 a.m. onwards when their teachers are in their rooms and able to supervise. Prior to 8:30 a.m. there is no supervision for children arriving early, so we encourage you to time your child's arrival at school for 8:30 a.m.

At pick up time children in the Junior classes can meet parents/whānau by the Junior playground (not in front of the Junior building) or the court area besides the school gardens adjacent to the hall. The garden area keeps everyone away from the car parking area for safety and to avoid congestion around the front of the building.

Medical Issues/Health Concerns:

Please make sure you have discussed any medical issues with either the Principal when completing your child's Enrolment form; or your child's class teacher. If your child's medical information needs to be updated, please collect a medical form from the school Office. This information is confidentially saved into our Student Management System so that we can provide your child with the necessary care.

Summer Uniform:



Please make sure children are wearing the correct summer school uniform in Term 4. This means the girls are to wear their 'summer' culottes, and all children are to wear a navy blue wide brimmed sun hat. Belfast School's school uniform are available for purchase from The Warehouse, Northwood Supacentre.

School Lunches:

Bakery items can be purchased for the children's lunches on Friday mornings for Friday lunch. Full details and order forms are available from the school Office.





Term 4 - Dental Team will be visiting soon:

FREE Dental care for children - including special information regarding Year 8 students

One of our Community Dental Service vans will be making a visit to your school soon.

- Only the children who currently require a check-up will be seen at this visit. Please do not be concerned if your child is not called for a check-up this time.
- The dental therapist will provide a regular check-up and preventative care which may include:
 - Cleaning/Scaling (to remove plaque from teeth)
 - Dental x-rays (to check for decay in teeth, or presence and position of teeth)
 - Fluoride Varnish (painted on teeth to help prevent decay)
 - Fissure Sealants (coating put on teeth to prevent decay) if required.
- If your child requires any other dental care, they will bring home a 'Care Plan' which will explain what dental care and appointment times are required.
- When you receive the 'Care Plan' please contact our Call Centre as soon as possible as you will need to arrange a time to bring your child to one of our Community Clinics for this dental care.
- Please contact our Call Centre if you want further information on the Community Dental Service, to enrol your child or if you have any specific questions about your child's dental care (a dental therapist will call you back)
- Year 8 students: all year 8 students enrolled with the Community Dental Service are transferred from the Community Dental Service to a FREE private dentist from year 9 until their 18th birthday. To help with this transition please ensure you have informed your child of their family dentist (not orthodontist). This will enable us to transfer your child onto the correct dentist for year 9 onwards. More information will be sent home after their year 8 check-up.
