Classes, sites and movement in 2024

A lot of thought has gone into developing classes for the new year. All whānau/caregivers have been notified if their child is moving classes or sites. Next year there are a couple of changes as to how things are looking at our Base site and our town sites:

Base school

In 2024 we are adding a new class to Base school. This will take us to six classes at Base. The new class will be in Kiwi room (beside the Multipurpose room), this has been used as a classroom in the past so is fully equipped with all we need to be turned back into classroom over the holidays. An additional classroom has meant that we are able to accommodate for a small amount of roll growth.

City sites

Next year our Miramar Central Satellite will be undergoing a refurbishment to meet the needs of our Kimi Ora tamariki. Whilst this is happening the amazing team at Miramar Central have very kindly gifted Kimi Ora an amazing new space that we can continue to run safely and successfully from whilst we await our renovations to our classrooms. We would like to thank Jackie (Principal of Miramar Central School) and her team for providing us this wonderful space and making things as minimally disruptive as possible during this time.

Moving forward, our Kimi Ora Miramar Central satellite will have primary age students and our Kimi Ora site at Evans Bay Intermediate will host our older students.


Birgit Kraemer, Teacher Aide

Phoenix is a stylish and unique dude whose gentle nature, relaxed attitude and sense of humor has made him a well-loved student by staff and classmates alike.


Phoenix has worked hard over his year at Kimi Ora to develop his communication, physical abilities and interests in his favourite curriculum subjects such as Science and Music.



"I feel love. I like being in class with my friends and I think it's fun." - Kaya




Hello, My name is Dallin.


