I remain convinced that as we seek to proclaim Jesus Christ in words and actions we will continue to see lives and communities changed.

The Archbishops will in time appoint a Commissary, and the Ven Jan Clark and Ven Anne van Gend are prepared to continue as Vicar-General and Deputy Vicar-General.

I would like to offer my deepest thanks to you for being prepared to invite, welcome and love Lorraine and I as we moved here in 2017. We have felt very loved, and want you to know how much this has meant to us.
