Kia ora koutou

This week has really felt like the depths of winter with cold and frosty starts and days that don't really warm up that much!

The last few weeks have been busy with field trips, sports trips and other exciting opportunities. It was great to see a large group of students from Years 7-11 head off to Kaikōura for a sports exchange on Tuesday. The students had fun and enjoyed the chance to compete with students from outside of the Hurunui.

At our last board meeting I shared our Term 1 attendance data. This is coming to us in a new format with the current government keeping attendance at school in the spotlight. Their goal is to see 80% of students attending school 90% of the time by 2030. I have shared a snapshot of our attendance below. It makes for interesting reading.



Note: regular attendance is 90%; irregular 80-90%; moderate 70-80%; chronic below 70%.

Interestingly, one day off every two weeks or 19 days across the school year is enough to place a student on that 90% mark. We do know that time off school is necessary for wellbeing, especially in the case of illness. We also know that non-attendance can have an impact on learning and progress. We are really keen to work in partnership with our school community to see our attendance rates get to above 80% of students attending 90% of the time. Our goal is to have engaging classes that encourage students to attend and support their progress. Our pastoral meetings include attendance as a focus and we will be communicating with families in situations where we feel that a lack of attendance is impacting progress.

A reminder that we will be sending mid-year reports home in Week 9. This will be followed by an opportunity to attend parent-teacher interviews in Week 10. A booking link and code for the interviews will be emailed home next week so that you can select a time to hold your interviews. To help with your planning the following details are relevant:

Interviews will be bookable between 3:40pm-5:30pm then 6:00pm-8:20pm on both Tuesday 2nd and Wednesday 3rd July (5:30pm-6:00pm is a dinner break for staff). Interviews will be 10 minutes in length

We encourage interviews to be in person; however, if you really are not able to make it into school, there will be an online option available.

We will confirm exact locations for each teacher; however, Year 1-6 interviews will be on the junior side and Year 7-13 interviews mostly in the gym or at another location on the senior side. We look forward to this opportunity to discuss and share progress with you.

Thank you to all of you who have been supporting the various fundraising initiatives that we have at present. This support for the students really is appreciated as it contributes to helping students attend amazing opportunities that are presented by the trips they will be going on.

Lastly, a reminder that our Matariki celebration dinner is being held on Monday 17th June and we have the public holiday on Friday 28th June. We look forward to seeing you at the celebration dinner if you are able to attend.

<u>Free Dental Care for Children</u> including special information regarding Yr 8 students

- One of our Community Dental Service mobiles will be visiting your school soon.
- We will be aiming to see that all children enrolled with the Community Dental Service have their dental care in the dental mobile while it is there
- Year 8 students: all year 8 students enrolled with the Community Dental Service are transferred from the Community Dental Service to a FREE private dentist from Year 9 until their 18th birthday. To help with this transition please ensure you have informed your child of their family dentist (not orthodontist). This will enable us to transfer your child onto the correct dentist for Year 9 onwards. More information will be sent home after their Year 8 check-up.
- To do this we will be asking the school to provide your child's name, address and your contact information.
- The dental therapist will not only be checking the children's teeth but will also Xray, clean, and apply protective treatments fluoride and or Fissure sealants (coating put on teeth to prevent decay) if required
- If your child requires further dental care such as fillings they will bring home a 'Care Plan' which will explain what dental care is required.
- When you receive the "Care Plan" please contact our Call Centre as soon as possible as
 you will need to arrange a time to bring your child to one of our Community Clinics for this
 dental treatment.
- As this dental unit is required at another location in approximately ____ weeks we would appreciate your co-operation in attending the allocated appointment time(s) with your child. Should this not be possible treatment may need to be completed at another location.
- Please also let us know ASAP if you wish to be present at your child's check up or if you do not wish your child to have any of the proposed dental care. You can phone 0800 846 983 or talk to the staff in the mobile
- Please contact us if you want further information on the Community Dental Service, to enrol your child, or if you have any specific questions about your child's dental care
