The ACM was launched in November 2019 in Auckland at a special celebratory Dinner. The first Convocation held on the same day, voted for the following Standing Committee to work on its behalf: Fraser McDermott (Chair) Thomas Brauer, Shashi Christian, Paul Williamson (Chair of AFFIRM but offered to be Treasurer), Joan Watson, Alan Bickers, Penny Field and Peter Lloyd. Lorraine was asked to be Secretary.

Under Fraser McDermott's excellent leadership, we noted recently that the ACM Standing Committee put 19 things in place in the past year to establish and keep things moving (including the name and logo graphics). The team is to be congratulated. There was a lot of work done behind the scenes despite having to meet via Zoom.

AFFIRM completes its task- AFFIRM had committed its staff and finance for 18 months to setting up the ACM. On the 6th of November at a celebratory dinner in Christchurch AFFIRM formally completed this work and the ACM was released to "fly solo". It was great to see so many of you there.
