

Mahinga Kai Inquiry	Mahinga Kai  Our first Inquiry is about Mahinga kai. Mahinga kai is about the value of natural resources that sustain life, including the life of people. It is important to manage and protect these resources, in the same way that ancestors have done before us.

Family Picnic and BBQ Friday 21 February 4-6pm	We like to celebrate the start of a new year with a Family Picnic and BBQ at the Pool. This is a lovely opportunity to come together as a school and relax while enjoying a swim and sharing of food. The school will supply sausages and bread and we ask you to bring your own refreshments and extra food as you require. For those people who are not key holders it will cost \$2.80 for a child to swim and \$5.10 for an adult to swim. If you are not swimming there is no cost. Look forward to seeing you there.	
Sport	The sport this term will be focussed on swimming - Teachers will be reinforcing skills taught from last year in preparation for our school swimming sports on Thursday 27 February. We will also be teaching games which focus on teamwork as well as fitness skills.	
Wheke Time	This is an important component of becoming 'confident, connected, actively involved, lifelong learners' (NZ Curriculum vision) Students are challenged to explore their passions / interests or strengths. This year we will be providing students with a variety of opportunities to be involved in an area they are interested in alongside a staff member, parent, whanau member or community member. If you have an area of interest or expertise which you may have time to support our students with in their learning on a Thursday afternoon, we would love to hear from you.	
Camps	Raupo Camp - Living Springs - Wednesday 18 March - Friday 20 March Living Springs Camp connects children with nature, finding adventure and making friends. Living Springs Kids Camp is an experience kids will never forget! Specific information will be coming to you from Raupo teachers very soon.

Literacy	Our literacy covers reading and writing and where possible will relate to the inquiry topic Mahinga Kai in Term 1. We encourage reading everyday at school and at home. Students will be reading from online sites as well as School Journals and age appropriate reading books. We also encourage writing each day, in some form for all students. This maybe dictation, spelling, creative writing, writing instructions, scripts, report writing, newsletter articles and more.	

Numeracy	The strand focus this term is Measurement, position and orientation. We look at angles, mapping, coordinates, compass directions etc and a range of terminology that is all maths related. This fits well with our Mahinga kai unit of inquiry within Whakaraupo. For our number focus we will explore financial literacy number facts, place value, number and position. Early on in the term all children will be given an e-ako sign in on the NZmaths website which allows them to log in at anytime during school or home and work on given material. This is especially good for practising times tables and basic facts knowledge.	
Kapahaka	We are in the process of finding new kaiako for our tamariki and will keep you informed.	
Y7/8 Technology	All Totara students are involved in Technology at Christchurch East School weekly on Monday afternoons throughout the year. Learning context for 2020 includes creative design (fabric and metal) and food technology. This will be starting week 2 (Monday 10th February). You should have received the information pamphlet on Wednesday (from your child's bag). Technology information	
Languages	Te reo will be integrated wherever possible through our daily practise. Totara students will also be taught French and Te Reo during Term 2 and 3 by Cashmere High School teachers.
