Welcome to our first newsletter for Term 1. Our focus for the year so far, has been very much on managing our pandemic response. It makes a nice change, in this newsletter to share some of the events and other information about our school. We have had many new families joining us this year so a big welcome to Belfast School. We hope you are enjoying being part of our whānau.

Building Planning

In 2019 the Ministry of Education approved the building of a second campus for Belfast School to accommodate a predicted population growth in the area. Our plan is for the school to be located over two sites - a junior campus on the current site for children in Years 1-4, and a senior campus on a new site for children in Years 5-8.

We are very excited to share with you the master plan for our current school site and the Preliminary Design Plans for our second campus in the new housing development opposite Belfast Road. Below you will see a range of images illustrating the main areas of these projects.

These plans are a culmination of 12 months' work with the school team, our school Mana Whenua advisor from Tuahuriri iwi, Leighs Construction (with WSP as Lead Designer) and the Ministry of Education to ensure our new spaces are aligned with our school's education vision.




Current school site (future Year 1- 4 Junior Campus)


There are redevelopment works planned for the current site. The next phase includes the refurbishment of our existing hall, demolition of the blocks that have Rooms 14-18 and the library, and Rooms 10-11, and the build of a new block that will hold four teaching spaces and a new library. Landscaping, including making changes to the drive and the car park to make this area safer, are planned to complete this project. We expect this work will begin around August, and is scheduled to be completed by July 2023. This work will be carefully sequenced to ensure the least possible disruption to teaching and learning while the build programme continues.

Long Term Master Plan for Current Site – future buildings include hall and classroom blocks






Development of the Year 5 - 8 Senior Campus


Now that our preliminary designs have been agreed, we are moving to the next stage of the design process. This will provide more detail to eventually enable the contractor to build our new campus, and we expect these designs to be completed by June 2022.

While this design work is taking place, from May there will be some construction activity at the new campus when the site clearance and preparation for the installation of foundations will begin.

We expect construction to commence in August this year for completion in June 2023. This timeline may be affected by ongoing issues associated with the pandemic, the high global demand for construction materials, and contingent on receiving building consent. We will keep you updated if there are any changes.

Many of you will have noticed the Belfast Village development progress, and in particular the construction of the supermarket adjacent to our new campus taking shape. This is a very exciting time for our community.

We will keep you updated as planning proceeds with both projects.

John Parsons Cyber Safety Education

Earlier in the term we brought in John Parsons to work with our children, staff and parents. We hope that John's work generated some discussions at home around how to be safe in online communities. John is an entertaining presenter with simple, clear messages for young people and their parents. While often we hear people compare the cyber world to the "real world", John does not make this distinction. His view is that the cyber environment is part of the real world and is something both children and adults should learn to be safe in.

John shared his traffic light for movies and video game classifications. Video games with Red classifications have content that is unsuitable for young people. Passive viewing of games with Red classifications (children watching adults play) is harmful to children's brain development as they are too young to process what they are seeing.

John has the following advice:

Parents/guardians need to familiarise themselves with the game the child wants to play before the child enters the game; alternatively sit alongside the child and experience the game with them.

Questions to ask:

- Are the games age appropriate?
- Is the quality of the language used in the games suitable for a child?
- How does the game make money out of a child's use?
- What processes are available to adults, should they need to make a complaint about a user?

The 360 Squad is the National Mens Artistic Gymnastics programme designed to identify talented and promising competitive athletes, and coach them into the performance pathway for national and international representation. Gymnasts trial from all over NZ annually for a place in the squad (approx. 20-30 are chosen across all ages/levels). They will have trainings together across the year in addition to their normal home gym training programme. This is to build a bond/familiarity between the boys across NZ. High level coaches are recruited to work with these boys. It is an honour to be selected for the squad and highly sought after amongst the boys. The name 360 refers to a team score of 360 that would guarantee a teams selection to the Olympics - always the ultimate goal. Wow this is an amazing effort Andre!
