THE LOTTERY BUSH CONSERVATION GROUP is hosting a

Community Information evening on Tuesday 30th June at 6.30pm - 8pm, Waiau Community Hall.

The Lottery Bush is a 55 hectare Department of Conservation reserve located between the Wandle Bridge and Mt Lyford Village accessed from the Inland Road.

Lottery Bush Scenic Reserve is an old-growth mixed native beech and podocarp forest that also provides habitat for threatened species, which is rare in the Canterbury region. Historically, Lottery Bush was an area traversed for travel, trade and access to mahinga kai.

Protecting this forest remnant is critical in creating a biodiversity corridor and link with other remnant forest areas and is a very high priority for the Department of Conservation.

The vision of the Lottery Bush Conservation Group is that 'Lottery Bush is a local treasure, an area valued for its "untouched" natural beauty and pest-free status. It is a space for children and adults alike to learn about our environment and watch as it triggers an expansion of our native landscape.'

Everybody is welcome. We are a diverse group of people interested in the conservation, preservation and biodiversity of the Lottery Bush for the community.


