Level 2 Update from Amuri Community Health

From 14th May Amuri Health will still operate under controlled access to the building. Appointments will be available both by telephone and face to face, as necessary. These will continue to be charged at the same rate.

The doors will remain locked and we ask that everyone please ring for an appointment before arriving to ensure adequate triage and contact tracing can be undertaken.

Screening questions as to your current symptoms and symptom history will continue to be asked. Your honesty and openness with our triage questions ensures everyone's safety and is essential so we can all keep moving forward.

Entry will be restricted to one patient at a time and, where possible, only the patient being seen will be permitted entry. If anyone feels they need a support person or family member present, please discuss this when booking your appointment so arrangements can be made for this.

We will continue to utilise the 'car park waiting room' for a few weeks yet to control any congestion within the facilities. Please let us know when you arrive for your appointment and wait in your car. Your clinician will come and get you when they are ready to see you.

If you have made an appointment due to being unwell, or have been identified as being at risk, you will be asked to enter the building from the back ambulance bay park, again please let us know when you arrive and wait in your car until your clinician is ready to see you.

As a team we have decided we will continue to wear masks/gloves and will ask that you use hand sanitiser and put on a mask on arrival also for the time being, these will be readily available at the entrance to the health centre.

We will continue to offer postal and email invoicing but our eftpos payment facility will again be available. Please stand back behind the line at the reception until the receptionist has entered the required details and asks you to step forward for your payment. The eftpos machine will be sanitised after each transaction.

Level 2 will allow us to resume our standard screening programmes, laboratory testing, drug testing, ear syringes, podiatry, and minor procedures. Licencing renewals will commence in 2 weeks.

Covid-19 testing will continue to be undertaken for those with respiratory symptoms and it is vital those with symptoms (cough/runny nose/sore throat/loss of smell) get checked out.

Flu vaccination continues to be available.

We thank you for your patience and understanding as we all adapt to new ways of operating to ensure safety and health in our community.

WAIAU BRIDGE CLOSURES

Now that we are out of lockdown, repairs will continue on the Waiau Bridge. This will involve some weekend night closures.

While the bridge is closed, there will be a 40-minute detour via River Road, continuing along Leslie Hills Road onto Mouse Point Road (SH7). Detour arrows will be set up to direct traffic.



What will we be doing?

On Saturday 23 May we will be cutting the damaged pier free from the bridge deck and sitting it on the temporary works. On Sunday night 24 May the bridge will be closed so we can jack up the bridge and realign it. During the closures on Saturday 6 and Sunday 7 June we will be cutting the expansion joints in the bridge deck. There may be some noise from this work. During the next weekend closures (20 and 21 June) we will be concreting the expansion joints.

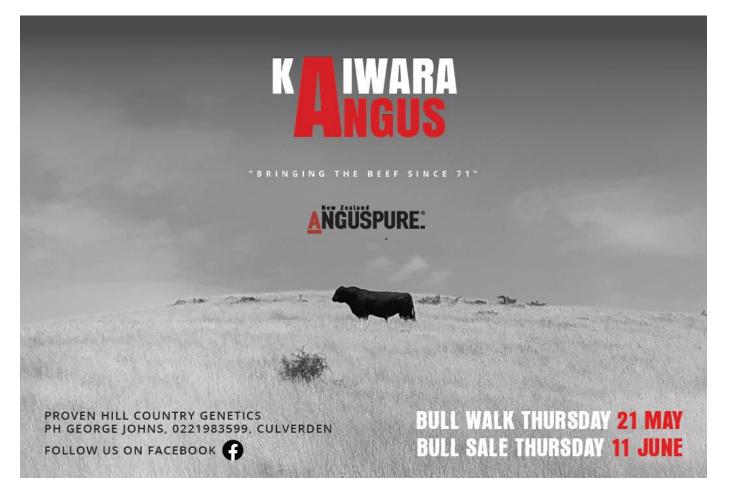
