Side-Line for Doubles	<p><u>Singles Scoring</u> Server serves from the <u>RIGHT</u> service court if their score is an <u>EVEN</u> number.</p> <p><u>Doubles Scoring</u> When the opposition is serving and your side wins a point, the new server will be the person in the RIGHT service court if your score is now an EVEN number. This person will continue to serve, changing service courts, until you lose a point. If you get this right the other player will serve the next time.</p>	<p><u>Singles Scoring</u> Server serves from the <u>LEFT</u> service court if their score is an <u>ODD</u> number.</p> <p><u>Doubles Scoring</u> When the opposition is serving and your side wins a point, the new server will be the person in the LEFT service court if your score is now an ODD number. ## **Scoring**

### **Singles**

The side winning a rally shall add 1 point to their score and will serve next. Players shall serve from the left service box if their score is odd and the right service box if it is even.

### **Doubles**

The side winning a rally shall add 1 point to their score and will serve next.

Players shall serve from the left service box if their score is odd and the right service box if it is even. This means that whichever partner is on the appropriate side shall serve. **If you get this right, the serve should alternate between you and your partner.**
