In the current climate, the opportunity to create some diversity in your farming systems is becoming increasingly important. As a farmer this means understanding your land and where those areas are so that you can optimise your land use to be able to supplement, support, and boost your farm's primary goal of food and fibre production. Land use capability (LUC) mapping allows for the identification of marginal and less productive areas of land. Having done this, you can assess those poorer producing areas and then assess the cost-benefit of other land uses, in this case forestry (native and/or exotic). The assessment compares the long-term economic potential of each land use and the associated environmental affects (carbon footprint, biodiversity, and freshwater). The AgriBusiness Group have undertaken several case studies using LUC mapping with the outcome for the farmer and the environment being strong. We are encouraging farmers and industry to look in the same direction for a solution to maintaining profitable farms that are sustainable in their production.

During this process, the three key outcomes for farm's undertaking land use change have been:

- A): More profitable, stronger farm systems carbon and timber are long term, lucrative sources of farm income that return far greater on LUC7+ country than red meat food and fibre. Integrating other land uses in some or all of these areas strengthen the farm revenue through diversification (e.g. carbon, honey, or timber), to support the highs and lows of red meat and other farm systems. This also allows farmers to shift their focus on farming animals onto the more productive areas of the farms.
- B): Carbon neutral farming and climate change resilience by 2025, all farms will require their carbon footprint to be calculated and managed accordingly. As forestry is a carbon positive activity, only small amounts are typically required to offset sheep and beef farm systems, or even higher emitters, such as dairy or dairy support. By registering those forests into the ETS, farmers are assisting New Zealand, and even the globe, at achieving crucial climate change targets through sequestration.
- **C):** Maximised farm sustainability and biodiversity understanding your farming land use capability allows you to optimise the land to its greatest potential. The process of this naturally means a more sustainable land use which promotes the regeneration and growth of on farm environmental and ecological values. With that comes increased biodiversity in the form of native fauna, flora, and soil organisms through habitat establishment and protection
