448 pages, suitable for any year level.




In this thriller/mystery, three boys at an exclusive school must clear their names and find the culprit after their headmaster is killed and they are the named the prime suspects...



256 pages, suitable for any age.








This book looks at the lives and choices of the men who were caught up in all angles of the Gallipoli campaign, showing the reader the human faces behind the battle.
