

Vaccines are free if:

- You are 65 years and over
- You are pregnant
- You have a chronic health condition.

All **non-funded** vaccines cost **\$25** for registered adults and children or **\$36** for non-enrolled patients.

Please also be aware that you are required to have a two-week gap before or after your flu vaccination before you can get your covid vaccine as per Ministry of Health vaccination guidelines.

Amuri Health will be offering covid vaccines and will advertise when these will start.



Presents an exciting opportunity that could provide your family with their first home ownership in Waiau from as little as \$10,000 deposit and repayments @ \$250 per week (minimum and subject to change, and criteria applies). The Hurunui Community Development Trust is interested to hear from you about how we can make your property ownership dreams a reality through a shared equity scheme.

- Our Shared Ownership Programme provides an opportunity for you and HCDT to share the ownership of a property. You would buy a majority share of the property (usually 60% or more) making it more affordable for you than if you were to buy 100%.
- HCDT would retain ownership of the remaining share of the property (e.g. 40%) and both you and HCDT would be recorded on the property title as owners until you are able to buy us out. Most households are able to do this within 7-10 years. You will need a deposit (your savings plus KiwiSaver) and a mortgage for the balance of the purchase price to buy your share. This will all be explained to you in detail before you are asked to sign a Shared Ownership Agreement. Look at this example where you buy 60% and HCDT retains the remaining 40%.





Example figures for ownership of a 60% share in a property priced at \$350,000.

Property's market value (for example only) \$350,000. Household buys 60% of the property with their deposit and bank mortgage \$210,000, Hurunui Community Development Trust share is the remaining 40% of the property \$140,000.

The Trust have commenced the first of potentially ten family homes, which is scheduled for completion this coming spring. This home is four-bedroom, two bathroom on a 988m2 section in the heart of the Waiau township with close proximity to the recently built Playcentre, community pool and across the road from Waiau School.
