The latest issue of <u>Distance Education</u> has been published. Lots of interesting articles concerned with "presence".

It is a highly ranked journal, edited by Dr Som Naidoo, who was the keynote speaker last year for our 30 year anniversary of distance learning symposium.

If you are thinking about possible places to publish your research into your teaching, then you might like to consider the broader higher education journal called, <u>Practice and Evidence of the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning in Higher Education</u> (PESTLHE).

The <u>latest issue</u> has just been published, so do have a browse. It focusses on evidence-based studies from practitioners, meaning that it is a particularly good place to publish well written reports on those smallish projects that you may have undertaken.

PESTLHE is not only a great place to disseminate your work but also a good place to find easy to read articles with some wonderful ideas that you might find of use in your own teaching.

The latest issue of the <u>Commonwealth of Learning</u>'s (CoL) open access journal, *Journal of Learning for Development* is now out. The journal "provides a forum for the publication of research with a focus on innovation in learning and its contribution to sustainable development".

As such, distance education features prominently in this journal's articles.
