

### YEAR 7 & 8: Rotation 1

78ADV- Adventure Learning

Get outdoors in our local environment. Raft building, hut building, climbing, tramping and survival skills are some of the topics covered in this practical and interactive course. We will be heading to spots around Christchurch to learn new skills that connect us with each other and our environment.

### **78ART** – Creative Art

In this course we shall explore a range of artmaking techniques that will include drawing, painting and printmaking. This is a practical artmaking course that runs over a term.



### **78DIG-** Digital Technology

In this course you will be beginning your journey with digital technology at St Thomas. We will be working with some of the latest technology to produce some exciting digital outcomes, such as, video games, websites & branding materials. #### **78REO -** Te Reo Māori

In this class the students will learn basic vocabulary and tikanga for in and out of the classroom. The students will also develop their understanding and use of sentence structure for basic conversation.

#### YEAR 7 & 8: Rotation 2

### **78CUL** – Around the world in 40 days

In this subject we will escape the classroom and go travelling around the world. We will visit different countries and learn about their culture, history, language and even their food! France and Japan will be on the menu as well as other places you may never have heard of.

#### **78DSN** – Creative Industries

In this course we shall explore a range of artmaking techniques that will include design and photography that utilise Adobe software such as Photoshop along using cameras to capture images. This is a practical artmaking course that runs over a term.

### **78MUS** – Creative Music

Students that take this subject will learn how to develop their Music skills through the medium of Cartoon and Theme Music. We will be embarking on a journey of discovery, looking at early types of 'Storybook' Music to Walt Disney to today's most popular themes. Through this process students will learn to perform, collaborate, create and communicate the language of Music. Every student has a favourite character and they will also get the opportunity to create a mini soundtrack and set it to their stories.

### 78PAS – Pasifika Culture

This subject involves learning about our Pasifika cultures through the most active and engaging ways possible. We'll look at music, movement, dance, song, pastimes, language and food. This is about building cultural rapport and understanding, while also building STC's performance capabilities.

### Year 9: Rotation 1

**9ADV:** Adventure Based Learning

The 9 Adventure Course at STC allows students with an interest in the outdoors as a learning environment to gain skills, develop confidence, social and interpersonal relationships using the outdoors as a medium. It provides an opportunity for a more hands-on based subject and a learning pathway for those interested in the service and outdoor industry in NZ in later years. Topics that will be covered will include.

- · Orienteering (map reading, compass skills) Offsite and at school
- · ABL (Adventure Based Learning, teamwork and problem solving)
- · Mountain Biking (Develop basic riding skills, bike set up and safety) Offsite and at school.

### **9DIG:** Digital Technology

In this course you will be continuing with your journey with digital technology at St Thomas. We will be working with some of the latest technology to produce some exciting digital outcomes, such as, video games, websites & branding materials. You will be experiencing coding through mircrobits, sphereos and robots and using these to participate in challenges, such as the world-wide "Do Your Bit" challenge and the newly established Rubber Duck Awards. ### 9MUS: Modern Day Rockstar

This course looks at Music through the lens of the 21st century Musician. Students will be encouraged to write, perform, create, research and record music through some of their favourite styles. There is a strong focus on collaboration and music technology, intertwined with core music fundamentals, with the aim of developing enthusiastic and well-rounded musicians.



9TEC: Hard Technology

A great opportunity to jump into the world of Technology and get a taste for a range of technological disciplines. The course runs over 1 term during which you will learn to plan, design and construct a small timber project. You will also develop your technical drawing skills and be introduced to product design.

This course will be ideal to build a foundation of skills in the Technology Curriculum and will set you up for your future years in Graphics and Technology.

#### Year 9: Rotation 2

**9ART**: Creative Art

In this course, we shall explore a range of traditional artmaking techniques that include drawing, painting and printmaking techniques. You shall create etches, paintings and charcoal drawings and experience using a range of wet and dry media. This is a practical artmaking course.

#### 9CHI: Chinese Culture

Come and learn the most spoken language in the world! In this course we learn the basics of communicating in Chinese and some fascinating insights into Chinese culture. This course is for new students to Chinese or those who may have studied it before and any students wanting to take part in year 10 Chinese.

### **9DSN:** Design and Photography

In this course, we shall explore a range of artmaking techniques for design and photography outcomes. You will utilise Adobe software such as Photoshop and Lightroom to edit and develop images and typography. This is a practical artmaking course that requires you to complete coursework outside of class time.

#### **9HIS:** History

Students will be taken on a short but bumpy ride through humanities greatest achievements as well it's darkest moments. This journey will start at the Bronze Age and travel through to the present and into our possible future. It will immerse the boys into times gone by and will allow them to experience history by putting themselves in the shoes of some of the most important personalities throughout time, as well as in the shoes of the common folk. The boys will learn key historical skills and be challenged to discover aspects of world history that intrigue them, through two inquiries and presentations... ... OK, strap yourself in, as we travel back 5,500 years.





#### **Year 9 Optional Courses:**

Students can join 9REO and 9PAS courses for a term, half year of full year.

**9REO**: Te Huarahi o te tama tane

Following on from year 7 & 8, the students will continue to develop their vocabulary on more varied topics. The students will also continue to develop their understanding of sentence structure and go into more depth with their understanding of tikanga and kawa, with a focus on the powhiri process. This exposing the students to more kaupapa Māori and te ao Māori.

**9PAS:** Pasifika Studies

This subject involves learning about our Pasifika cultures through the most active and engaging ways possible. We'll look at music, movement, dance, song, pastimes, language and food. This is about building cultural rapport and understanding, while also building STC's performance capabilities.
