PTA June 2020

Firstly my apologies for not being here in person. I have meetings in town today as discussed with Fiona.

This has been a strange year resulting in some cancellations of events that the PTA would usually contribute to and on the flip side some significant additional costs as a result of lockdown and provision of online learning etc. Some of what I have asked for below is in truth already purchased out of necessity due to COVID or due to the fact we normally have this conversation 6 months earlier however you will see the why on each item. These were items outside of budget but important as we went into lockdown. In the interests of transparency I have highlighted these rows. As discussed with Fiona I have put in approx. 30K of requests for your consideration as a group. I have attached a specific request for support for the social studies tour and have put in 2K provisionally into this request for your consideration.

Some events i.e. SISS netball etc are still TBC in an ever changing world but we are hoping to send this team away as ever.

Once again I would like to thanks you all for the work you all put in for our school in so many ways.


So how are things going?

The roll continues to climb sitting now at 363 with us looking pretty secure to end the year on an all time high of 370. Our work continues on the education brief for the redevelopment which could be 4 classes or could be a whole senior rebuild. We are aiming high and our brief will state the case for the latter.

We are currently fully staffed which is fortunate given the employment situation from COVID which has resulted in zero overseas teachers coming in the fix the teacher shortage in secondary. This is being achieved by some pretty awesome staff who have shown resilience and a great deal of flexibility to meet our learners needs. We are currently re-advertising for the room 3 position to replace Karen as she has won the position of Learning Support Coordinator for our cluster. The first pool of applicants was poor to say the least and we are looking for the very best people without compromise.

Your contributions last year were well used in particular the student support fund which I used to confidentially assist families with camps/ devices/uniforms/trips and stationery. It is a source of pride for our school that no child misses out through lack of money. I am as ever unwilling to disclose who received this due to confidentiality however I can assure you it was well used.

The Board have worked hard to set a clear strategic direction for the school and this will inform our future strategic planning and the redevelopment. Our focus areas are:-

The recent lockdown experience challenged our team in many ways however we were fortunate that we were already well prepared with cloud based infrastructure and the ability to distribute school owned devices for students (many of which the PTA purchased). Our recent review of this provision was positive and provided us with some great feedback should we ever have to go down that road again.

Redevelopment aside the next few months will see the re netting of the netball courts, complete asphalt replacement on the junior side, installation of a new outdoor full sized basketball court, a power upgrade to see us into the future and the architectural proposal for the redevelopment of the old boiler room on the primary side onto a working space for our new Learning Support Coordinator.

One issue for the remainder of this year is the financial hardship for families who may have lost an income or two and the general slowing of the economy. We do have affected families in this regard.

To support our students with time lost you will have read the reduction in required standards and we have also arranged extra credit first aid courses, cancelled study leave in favour or teaching right up the test (or to completion for internal standards) and the provision of extra standards that can be achieved in the timeframes we have. Exams have also pushed out with the last exam now being on our last day of school!

I hope this small summary of what is happening helps and I will be more than willing to discuss any aspect of this at the next meeting.
