Dear Parents/Caregivers and Whanau

Tena koutou katoa. Ngā mihi nui ki a koutou katoa. As-salamu alaykum. Hola. Talofa. Kon'nichiwa. Kamusta. Nĭ hău. Namastee. Magandang hapon.

We have enjoyed a very positive beginning to our year despite the interruptions caused by the Alert Level changes. Junior classes have adapted well to the temporary changes to their class locations, with the unexpected bonus of being able to enjoy the newly developed gardens right outside their doors. Seeing parents / caregivers relaxing and chatting in the garden area has encouraged us to think about developing more of these spaces around the school as part of our building redevelopment. The construction work on the junior building is progressing as expected and has had very little impact on our usual day-to-day operations.

Building Programme

We are very excited to have begun the design process for our building programme, which involves refurbishment of our current site and building our second site in the housing development alongside Johns Road. The first phase of the design process is Master Planning. This involves deciding where buildings will be placed on the two locations, and the layout of the sites to allow for expansion as the population grows. Leighs Construction Limited, architects from WSP New Zealand, and landscape architects from Glasson Huxtable are leading the design process in conjunction with the Ministry of Education, our Mana Whenua Facilitator from Ngai Tahu and Belfast School Board of Trustees and Staff.

Our building project is a little more complex than other schools as it involves two sites; however, it is the uniqueness of the project that makes it more exciting. We will keep you informed on progress. Later in the year when the more detailed design of the buildings and landscape takes place, there will be opportunities for consultation with the community.

Swimming Instructors

Our free swimming lessons with the City Council instructors have been a huge success for the children in Years 3-6. Children have benefitted from the small group instruction and have made significant progress in learning new skills or developing their swimming expertise. The investment of \$11,000 has been very worthwhile, especially for those children who have mastered the first steps of learning to float and the basics of freestyle. We are looking forward to seeing the students in Years 5-8 demonstrating what they have learnt in their swimming sports. We were impressed with the swim instructors who spent full days working in the pool with the children. We plan to work with the City Council again in 2022 to provide a similar opportunity for classes.

Lions Club

If you have been able to enjoy our expanded gardens, or see photos of the gardens on our website or Facebook page, you will know that this has been due to the generosity of the Papanui-Waimairi Lions Club. All materials were provided free to the school and the Lions Club members, along with staff and a small number of people from our community worked together to construct the new planter boxes, seating and irrigation. This project is an example of the type of work Lions Clubs do in the community. Lions are looking to set up a local Belfast Club and information is contained later in this newsletter about how you can become part of this. A local club would be a huge advantage for the Belfast community, especially for our school and other education centres in the area, which would benefit from further projects.

Vandalism around the school grounds

Sadly, there have been on-going incidents of vandalism occurring around our school grounds, in the swimming pool and affecting property belonging to the Belfast Community Network over the past few months. This is disappointing and frustrating for us all, especially as it seems to be involving local youth. We have been grateful to members of our community who have tidied up after incidents or contacted us with information. We want our community to enjoy the facilities in our grounds and the wonderful spaces we are surrounded by. If you see behaviour that is unacceptable, and damaging to our environment and property, we encourage you to contact the Police, who have the resources and expertise to deal with these situations.



Alert Level changes

Thank you for supporting us in meeting the public health requirements associated with changes in alert levels. We have been impressed at the continuing resilience of our children and their ability to be independent in arriving at school, and getting themselves organised. We have endeavoured to go ahead with as many events as possible to reduce disruptions and we thank you for understanding that this means parents / caregivers cannot often not participate. The reality is that these changes will continue for some time until the vaccination programme has been rolled out across the country and we can return to a more normal way of living and working. In the meantime we can all do our part by following the guidelines for staying healthy and safe. Stay home if you are sick, keep scanning to track your movements and wash your hands.

If the uncertainty we are dealing with is causing challenges for you and your whānau there are supports available through a number of community agencies. You can find information through Unite against COVID-19

This week we have officially moved into Autumn. The weather will become more variable meaning children are more likely to be bringing sweatshirts and jackets to school, although only needing them for part of the day. Please can you check your child's clothing is named clearly as this is the time of the year we see an increase in lost property.

Starting Time for School:

Children are able to enter their classrooms from 8:30 a.m. onwards when their teachers are in their rooms and able to supervise. Prior to 8:30 a.m. there is no supervision for children arriving early, so we encourage you to time your child's arrival at school for 8:30 a.m.

Thanks to all our parents / caregivers and whanau for supporting our school programmes and ensuring children are at school on time, ready for learning. It all contributes to our children being able to achieve their best.

Fonterra Milk for Schools

Our school is a participant in the **Fonterra Milk for Schools** programme. This programme has recently changed and is now



providing a **Breakfast Club** rather than the individual milk cartons as they have in the past. This means that the children are no longer receiving the milk daily.

The new **Kickstart Breakfast** now offers Weetbix and Milk and is in conjunction with Fonterra, Sanitarium and the Ministry of Social Development.

Due to the logistics of setting up this Breakfast Club programme, we are planning to trial it with the children in the Upper Middle Syndicate. The Breakfast Club will run between Rooms 14 and 15, Rooms 16 and 17 and Room 18 will have their own Club. The Breakfast Club is an optional programme and the aim is to supplement the children's breakfast. We strongly encourage children to continue eating breakfast prior to coming to school.

Redwood Kea Group:






