<p>You are an active participant in your own learning.</p> <p>You independently involve yourself in a wide range of classroom tasks and learning activities.</p> <p>In class you independently, actively and willingly respond to questions, group tasks etc, and are focussed on your learning.</p>	<p>You need a few prompts by the teacher to actively involve yourself in learning activities.</p> <p>When prompted, you are a willing participant and make good contributions to a range of tasks and learning activities.</p> <p>When prompted you willingly respond to questions, group tasks etc.</p>	<p>You need some teacher prompting to involve yourself in classroom tasks and learning activities.</p> <p>You participate, and make some contributions to some tasks and activities.</p> <p>You respond to teacher prompts positively and will contribute to some class discussions, group tasks etc.</p>	<p>You need a high level of prompting to involve yourself in classroom tasks and activities.</p> <p>You rarely contribute to your own learning or to the learning of others.</p> <p>You respond to teacher prompts with minimal positivity, and contribute to group tasks, class discussions with a high level of teacher facilitation.</p>	<p>You do not participate or contribute to class activities and learning tasks.</p> <p>Prompts are often met with grunts, shrugs or similar negativity.</p> <p>You are easily and willingly distracted, and will distract others.</p> <p>There is minimal or no involvement in classroom learning tasks and activities.</p>
