'Wai Water?'

Currently in class, Year 13 Agricultural Science students have been working towards an Achievement Standard, being to carry out an investigation into an aspect of a New Zealand primary product or its production.

The Topic This Year Is 'Wai Water?'

More specifically this has meant the study of the effect of milk production management practices on water quality and biodiversity in the Hinds River

Teacher Abbey Bruce said that, as part of this, the class spent one day, on $Monday\,04\,April, collecting\,water\,samples\,to\,look\,at\,Nitrate\,levels, Phosphate$ levels, water clarity, conductivity, sedimentation and invertebrate samples from various locations along the Hinds River.

The focus at each of the six Align Farms, is the social, environmental and commercial responsibilities of farming. Their approach is to advance human health by producing high-quality, nutrient-rich food and aligning farming with nature. Align Farms believe it's possible to minimise farming's environmental impact, while maximising profitability, and they are learning everything they can about regenerative farming, to help develop a more sustainable approach.

Following the day 'in the field' the class - on Thursday 07 April - had a panel of guest speakers come in and discuss the results.
