HOCKEY:

2015 saw a total of 80 boys playing competition hockey for Timaru Boys', with five teams playing over three divisions.

In the 3rd division we had three teams; the Panthers, the Lions and our TBHS 3rds team. The Panthers started the season on the wrong side of some sound thrashings but after gradual all round improvement, finished by playing in the Plate final and were unlucky to be beaten 2 - 1 by Geraldine.

The TBHS 3rds team also ended up playing for 3rd and 4th place against our Lions team. In an exciting, closely fought game the 3rds pulled off a 3-2 win against the determined Lions.

In the 2nd division the TBHS 2nds ended up, again in the Plate final, playing Excelsior but losing 4 to 3.

Our 1st XI, in the Senior Mens' 1st division yet again finished up in the Plate final but was beaten by Northern Hearts.

Tournament week saw our 2^{nd} XI team compete at the Galletly Cup in Blenheim. This tournament is open to all 2^{nd} XI hockey teams. Here they ended up playing for 5^{th} and 6^{th} place against Wellington College finishing 6^{th} after a close 1-0 defeat.

The 1sts travelled to Auckland to participate in the Rankin Cup/India Shield. After pool play the top 16 teams compete for the Rankin Cup and the bottom for the India shield. After ending up in a very tough pool the 1sts, although playing well lost all three of their pool games which put them into the India Shield. They went on to win every game from there on in, culminating in winning the final with a convincing 2 nil victory over Auckland Grammar and bringing home the India Shield which has only been won once previously by TBHS.

RUGBY:

2015 was a tough year for our 1st XV in the University of Canterbury Championship. Injuries to key players and changes in the coaching team mid-season affected the team but it was pleasing to see the boys never lose their heart and several good results were had at the end of the season. Losses in all the exchanges were disappointing and a final placing of 10th out of the 15 teams was not the result the team was seeking.

In the local Under 18 grade we had two even teams who were clearly the best in the grade and deserved the right to play in the Final. The final score was 22-18 to the Blue team in this game in what was a very tough game.

In the local Under 16 grade our 15A Colts team were the best of our three teams. They finished 3rd for the season. The other two teams Blue and White also had good seasons finishing 5th and 8th.

The 15A Colts team had a very successful tournament losing only one game to the host school Shirley Boys on the first day. Thereafter the team won games well versus Nelson College, Kings High and Christs College to gain a very respectable 3rd place from 8 teams. Several boys stepped up well over the week and have a lot of potential for the future.

In the local Under 14.5 grade we had 5 out of 14 teams in the grade. Our results were adequate this season but there are areas where we need to improve. The Panthers, Jaguars and Leopards finished in the bottom half of the grade but the Tigers and Cheetahs were very impressive, finishing 3rd and 6th respectively.
