Dear Parents/Caregivers

Tēnā tātou i raro i te maru o Ngāi Tahu. Ngā mihi nui ki a koutou katoa. As-salamu alaykum. Hola. Talofa. Kon'nichiwa. Kamusta. Nĭ hău. Namastee. Magandang hapon.

Ngā mihi mahana kia koutou - warm greetings to you all.

It really feels like winter now with darker mornings and evenings, and consistently cold days. I think we all notice the impact of less sun and needing to be inside more. We have done really well without the hall for assemblies and this week, for the first time, we needed to postpone assembly due to the weather. We are monitoring the forecast and hoping to reschedule assembly next week. We have awards to present to children, Awhi certificates and badges, Blues Awards and Upstander certificates, to acknowledge their success and achievements. We like to do this at assemblies so children, parents and staff across the school can be part of congratulating our positive roles models. Upstander certificates are awarded to children who have shown leadership in situations where things have gone wrong, and step up to support and assist others.

Buildings:

The remediation work to the Junior block is nearing completion. The scaffolding will come down in a couple of weeks and the final painting work will be finished off. The building inspection, cleaning and consent process is due to be completed by the last week of term. By the beginning of Term 3 the Juniors will be relocated back to Rooms 1-7.

The Master planning phase for the new site, (Senior Campus) has progressed and is nearing completion. Master planning involves the design of where buildings will be located on the site, which parts of the site will be allocated to playing areas, car parking, pedestrian access, and where additional buildings will be placed as the roll grows. Master planning for the Senior Campus includes the location of Allenvale School and their amenities areas. Once the Ministry of Education has approved the architects design we will be able to share the final plan with the community. The Master Planning phase for our current site (eventually the Junior Campus) is also progressing but is at an earlier stage than the Senior Campus.



Ako Conferences - for Parents/Caregivers, Students and Teachers:

These conferences will take place on Wednesday 23 June, 2:15-5:30pm and Thursday 24 June, 3:15-7:30pm. The Board of Trustees has approved **school finishing at the earlier time of 2:00pm on Wednesday, 23 June** to allow the Ako Conferences to begin at 2:15pm.

These student, parent / caregiver and teacher conferences are an opportunity to talk about your child's progress and their learning focus for the next stage of the year. The mid-year report you will receive this week is part of the process as it will provide information about the level your child is currently working at. Discussions with your child's teacher will help clarify what their strengths are, and the areas they need more practice and support with. We encourage everyone to take this opportunity to participate in supporting your child's learning and development. We look forward to seeing you here next week.

Zones of Regulation:

Over the year teaching staff have continued to learn about, and implement the Zones of Regulation with classes. The purpose of teaching the Zones is to help children learn to self- regulate. Self-regulation is defined as having the ability to manage emotions (often disruptive emotions) and impulsive behaviour. Being able to think before reacting requires skills that children, and adults, need to develop so that they can participate in learning and maintaining relationships. We are seeing positive outcomes from this work. Children are beginning to use their words to describe their emotions, and making choices about ways to modify their behaviour.

This link What do the Zones of Regulation Look Like? gives you a simple overview of the four zones and the behaviour we either experience, or see in others when self-regulation is a challenge. The important message we give is that there is no wrong zone – everyone experiences a full range of emotions at different times. How you manage yourself in each of the zones is what is important. Ask your children to tell you about the zones or watch this video with them and talk about their understanding.

Gymnastics:

Mrs Rebekah Inwood has been training the gymnastics team who are competing at Christchurch School of Gymnastics on today. We have 30 children who have been training hard with Rebekah and will be competing at different levels. Rebekah is passionate about gymnastics and voluntarily takes the Gym Club outside of her teaching hours, providing a great opportunity for children who have interests in this sport.

Winter Sport:

Most staff will attend a morning or afternoon meeting on Tuesday, 22 June.
