Dear Parents/Caregivers

Tēnā tātou i raro i te maru o Ngāi Tahu. Ngā mihi nui ki a koutou katoa. Assalamu alaykum. Hola. Talofa. Kon'nichiwa. Kamusta. Nĭ hău. Namastee. Magandang hapon.

Ngā mihi mahana kia koutou – warm greetings to you all.

Thank you to all the parents / whānau who took part on our Ako conferences last week. We had a great turnout at all levels of the school. Over the week teachers hosted 292 conferences in total, which is an impressive achievement. As parents / caregivers, your own learning at primary school occurred with a different curriculum and teaching approaches. The changes in learning approaches since then and the growth of technology as a learning tool especially, will be quite different to much of what you experienced. We hope that you found the conferences a useful way to understand what your child has been working on, their progress and next learning steps. The opportunity to meet with teachers along with your children at the Ako conferences is one way of developing a partnership with us. We certainly appreciated you all making the time to come along.

Junior Classes on the move:

The scaffolding has been removed from the Junior Block and the last stages of getting the building ready for us to reoccupy are almost complete. Moving back into these spaces will take place over the last two days of the term. Contractors will move furniture and resources back on Friday. An alternative programme will be in place for the junior classes on Thursday and Friday as teachers organise their classrooms for the move. If time allows, junior class teachers will take their children for a walk through the building before moving takes place to help with the transition. This will be exciting for our New Entrant children who have not been in the Junior Block since they started school, and a reminder for those children who haven't been there since last year. From the beginning of Term 3 all junior classes will be back in Rooms 1-7.

We have really enjoyed having the juniors located near the front part of the school. At the end of the day the gardens have become a great communal gathering space for parents / caregivers waiting for children. We hope you continue to use this area before 3:00pm.

Assemblies:

While the Junior Block has been out of use we were able to hold school assemblies in various outside locations up until recently when the winter weather arrived. Our whole school assemblies give us the opportunity to present various awards to children and acknowledge their successes. Over the past two weeks, we have been waiting for a break in the weather to hold a final assembly for the term, however it has been much too cold. If we are not able to do this next week, we will find a way to give children their awards before the end of the term. Next term the hall will be available for assemblies again.



Te Ara Tühura Cluster:

Belfast School is one of eight schools in the Te Ara Tūhura Cluster (seven Year 1-8 schools, and one high school). This year the teachers from all the Cluster schools are working collaboratively in small groups focussing on researching new teaching approaches for reading and writing. During the term this involves teachers coming together for professional learning meetings at each other's schools from 3:30-5pm. Working with teachers from other schools is a valuable way to share ideas, develop new teaching approaches and create professional networks across primary and secondary schools. The purpose, and main outcome, is to accelerate students' learning in literacy. Next term teachers will join together for an after school Summit with workshops and further sharing of ideas.





Holidays:

Over the holidays, we hope you have time to relax, enjoy some family time and re-energise. We have done well to avoid any further interruptions due to the pandemic. Over the break you may be travelling or visiting places around the city with lots of people. The Ministry of Health continues to promote scanning QR codes so that, if needed, contact tracing can be done effectively to prevent further disruptions to our daily lives. Remember that *Level One is not Level None.*

Take care everyone and we look forward to seeing you all again in Term 3.


