CULVERDEN, ROTHERHAM AND WAIAU CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR REFUSE AND RECYCLING ARRANGEMENTS

Refuse and recycling collections in Culverden, Rotherham and Waiau over Christmas and New Year are running as per normal on a Thursday.

When using the Councils collection service, remember:

- Only Hurunui District Council bags will be collected, these are available for purchase at Culverden Four Square, Rotherham Store, Waiau Hardware and Amuri Library.

 Bundles of cardboard will not be collected; these can be recycled via the transfer stations.
- ·Bags must be securely tied and at the kerbside or Council collection point by 8am. ·Collection times may vary to normal, and the crew will not return to collect bags placed out late.
- ·Refuse bags must not exceed 15kg.
- ·Bags split prior to the crew's arrival and non-official bags will not be collected.

What is accepted via the recycling collections if clean, dry, and loose in a Council recycling bag?

- ·Newspapers, magazines, office paper and telephone directories.
- ·Cardboard, greetings cards, junk mail, envelopes, and egg boxes.
- ·Food, drink, and pet food cans
- ·Rigid plastic bottles and small containers, Types 1, 2 and 5 only with lids removed.

What cannot be recycled?

Soft plastics, paper with glitter on, plastics 3, 4, 6 and 7, tetrapaks, polystyrene (includes meat trays), plant pots, plastic strapping, clothing and shoes, food-stained paper or cardboard, coffee cups, plastic lids, foil trays and food waste are not recyclable. *If in doubt throw it out.*

Glass bottles must not be put in recycling bags. Please recycle via any transfer station. **Transfer Station Arrangements**

Culverden and Waiau Transfer Stations over Christmas and New Year will remain closed on Public Holidays. Normal opening hours apply at all other times.






