Respiratory Virus

We have a lot of unwell youngsters in our community at the moment.

Please remember to keep yourself/kids at home if are unwell with respiratory symptoms.

Respiratory viruses like the RSV virus are highly contagious for up to 8 days and can turn to pneumonia and bronchiolitis.

The under 2 year olds are particularly vulnerable and to protect them we need to isolate those who are unwell, reducing contact with them as much as possible.

Not all children will need to be seen or assessed by our clinicians as this can potentially spread the viruses further.

ALL over 65 year olds should now have been invited to book for their vaccination. We have, this week, begun inviting our community with Chronic 'at risk' health conditions, to book for vaccination, and the remaining of these will be contacted this week. This will mean ALL GROUP 3 in the Amuri community will have been reached for vaccination in the very near future.

If you have missed out on a text message or letter regards this and feel you should have been considered, please give us a call to let us know so we can discuss this further & book you in if appropriate.

This has been a very time-consuming process for our staff, and we have endeavoured to keep the community as updated with our progress as we can. We have appreciated your support and understanding in this.

Amuri Health Centre is now completing Group 3B/C.





HEALTH NOTICE - RSV Virus

In New Zealand there is currently an outbreak of the RSV virus.

RSV is the most common cause of **hospitalisations** for lower respiratory tract infections for under two-year-olds, with influenza/flu admissions being much less frequent.

It spreads rapidly through droplets when someone coughs or sneezes.



Please note antibiotics do not work on viruses so any child that has any of the above symptoms must not attend childcare until all symptoms have cleared.
