

EASY DOG TREAT RECIPE!

WARNING: check the peanut butter and make sure that it does not contain Xylitol, as this is extremely toxic to dogs.

You will need:

2 cups flour

$\frac{1}{2}$ cup of creamy peanut butter

2 eggs

$\frac{1}{4}$ cup water



Instructions:

1. Preheat oven to 170 degrees Celsius.
2. Mix flour, peanut butter and eggs in a bowl until slightly combined.
3. Add water a little at a time until it is wet enough to create a dough.
4. Roll out the dough and use cookie cutters or a knife to create the shapes you want.
5. Place on a baking sheet and cook for about 15 mins.
6. Allow to cool.
7. Give your dog a taste!!
