An MOE approved project management company, Tectum Consulting, and a builder have been engaged with construction beginning as soon as we have final sign-off from the MOE and necessary consents are obtained.

The Katikati Innovative Horticulture Project is a collaborative approach by the Katikati Innovative Horticulture Trust, Katikati College, horticultural training providers and industry to bring together education, skills and training opportunities offering pathways into horticulture, under one umbrella, based at Katikati College.

The Trust has been set up for charitable purposes, including advancing the objectives of the Katikati College Innovative Horticulture Programme, developing and maintaining assets associated with this programme, and enabling facilities to be used to improve personal, social and educational outcomes for the benefit of all participants, both from the College and the community.

We have consulted widely with industry and other key stakeholders in the region, including iwi, and local groups such as Rotary and Lions. We have also participated in the Katikati Taiao Community Led Research project and have sought input from other participating organisations, in particular regarding personalised learning and employment pathways and connection/disconnection of youth to education.

This project has strong support from the local horticulture industry. In-kind and/or financial support has also been confirmed by a number of horticultural industry leaders and local businesses and organisations. The project also has the active support of the Labour Education and Workforce Caucus Committee, the Western Bay of Plenty District Council, Horticulture New Zealand's Horticulture Capability Group and local and regional National and Labour MPs.

Current financial status of the Horticulture Centre build

A financial review as at 31 August confirmed that the build will cost \$615,000. This results in a fully functional building. As shown below, at least \$99,000 is still needed.





