Dear Parents/Caregivers

Tēnā tātou i raro i te maru o Ngāi Tahu. Ngā mihi nui ki a koutou katoa. Assalamu alaykum. Hola. Talofa lava. Kon'nichiwa. Kamusta. Nĭ hău. Namastee. Magandang hapon. Ni sa bula vinaka. Kia orana. Fakatalofa atu. Malo e leilei. Hujambo.

We have reached the end of a challenging and uncertain year. The pandemic has changed the way we have needed to operate as a school and as a community. As a state school, we have implemented the requirements of the Ministry of Health and Ministry of Education while keeping our school programmes running with as little disruption as possible. Over the past week we have been able to end the year with our syndicate fun days here at school, and although the weather has been cooler than we would have hoped, the children have had a great time.

Counting the AWHIs:

Every week throughout the year, each class tallies the number of AWHIs given out to the children. Individual totals are used for awarding the stickers, postcards, pizza lunches, certificates and badges at Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum levels. Whole class totals are used to award classes *Sparkle Time* (a special award time in class), and the whole school totals are used for fun days. This year the number counted reached **89,093 individual AWHIs!** Every one of these AWHIs was given with at least one positive comment from a teacher. What an amazing achievement! We know that sometimes, AWHIs end up in the washing machine at home, or lost in the playground, so the total is probably even higher. Look out for AWHIs at home in pockets next year and encourage your children to bring them back to school to be counted.

School Survey:

Recently we surveyed you as part of our process in reviewing our curriculum. Thank you to the 104 participants who completed the survey. The results affirmed the themes that came out of discussions with the group of parents / caregivers we met with earlier in the year. With 80% or more agreement in almost every category, it is very gratifying to get such positive feedback;

- 94% agreement that teachers work hard to meet children's needs,
- 91% agreement that children are learning to be safe online,
- 94% agreement with the way technology is used at Belfast School,
- 95% of children are proud to attend Belfast School.

Our work on reviewing the curriculum will continue next year as we prepare for our two site school

Important Information for Bus Children:



We wish to advise that the bus provider has changed to Torlesse Travel from the start of Term 1, 2022. "Swipe Keys" for Belfast Community Pool - Vaccine Mandated Pool 12 yrs 3 mths:



Keys are available for hire from the school Office **UNTIL** 10.30 a.m. Friday, 17 December. A **Key Holder's agreement and pool rules** are to be read and signed at the time of purchase. You will also need to show your 'My Vaccine Pass'. You will be able to access the pool after school, at the weekends and during the Christmas school holidays. If you plan to hire a swipe key we encourage you to organise this before the Office closes.

Stationery Packs for 2022:

Remember to order your child's stationery pack online at www.myschool.co.nz In the orange box type in Belfast School, click onto the school's name then onto "view the requirements list". This information was also included in your child's class placement letter. Children are required to have the correct stationery requirements for the first full day of school on Tuesday, 8 February 2022.

If your contact details have changed, please update these with the office. We often find that phone numbers change causing problems when we need to make contact. We need to have accurate contact details for the parents / caregivers of all children.

Do you have a child turning 5 years old in the next six to nine months?

If you have a child **turning 5 between now and December 2022** who will be attending Belfast School, please enroll your child. If you are not sure if you have completed an enrolment form, please email your child's name and date of birth to principal@belfast.school.nz so Sally can check our records. We need to know how many 5 year olds are starting so we can plan for their visits etc.



Please note that if you have moved out of Belfast School's enrolment zone since your first child started school, you will need to complete an Out of Zone Enrolment form.

Dental Care during the Summer School Holidays:

The Community Dental Service will be providing dental care for children enrolled with our service during the upcoming school holidays. The clinics will offer treatment and relief of pain sessions by appointment only. Gangsters! Cream pies! Singing! Dancing! And Splurge guns...


