FORM 7 PROGRAMME for this year, as well as giving the widest possible choice of subjects, also aims at using the skills and interests of these young adults to help others in the school. Some 7th Formers are helping Mr Abbott to organise the Athletic Sports, some will be assisting in the Reading Programme and giving extra help to our new Vietnamese pupils and some will be learning counselling skills so that they can help Mr Blackman, our second guidance counsellowing programmes with all third formers.

All 7th formers will be going on camp out at "The Narrows" for 23rd, 24th and 25th February, where they will learn more about Human Relationships, Tertiary Education, Politics and Race Relations. Michael Minogue, M.P., Mr Stafford Smith - Waikato University Liaison Officer, Mr Les Macaskill from the Post Primary Inspectorate and Mr Hiwi Tauroa, Race Relations Conciliator will all be contributing to the programme.

THE HELP WE NEED FROM PARENTS

There are many general ways in which we ask your support as parents:

School Uniform is to be strictly enforced for Forms 3 and 4 and 1st year 5th Formers and you will help us by seeing that correct uniform is provided.

Miss Tucker suggests that if you intend knitting a school jersey you get your wool promptly. The colour "Suede" has now been discontinued but there are 30 packets only of it remaining at "Knitting Wools and Patterns" in Victoria Street. So far we have seen no colour like it on the charts of any company. "Suede" is an Aotea wool.

Pupils in their 4th year or above at school are not restricted as to colour and style of clothing but again we ask that it be practical, neat and tidy.

Jeans, Jandals and beach-wear are not acceptable.

Homework: You should expect that pupils will have homework regularly in several subjects per night - work which is necessary for successful completion of the syllabus. Sometimes, of course, the work may not be written, reading can be work too. If your son or daughter never appears to have anything to do, or on the other hand appears to be struggling with impossible demands, form teachers would be glad to hear from you.

School Fees: You will know from your children that school fees are now due. We quote from the Prospectus

"The annual school fee provides for educational, cultural, sporting and social activities (including capital expenditure), prizes, break-up functions and other sundry expenses as may be determined by the Board for the benefit of pupils.

The Board has ruled that fees for 1981 are:

\$18 for one student from a family

\$33 for 2 students from a family

\$45 for 3 or more students from a family

The School cannot function without this money and we would ask that wherever possible it be paid NOW.

Special Helpers

In addition to the responsibilities placed on you all, the school would be very glad to have help from parents of either sex who are able to give a little time. Should there be older, unemployed young adults in your household they could also be of great help to us in one of two areas.

(a) The Canteen: Mrs Taylor needs more helpers. She says:

"I need some more helpers for the canteen. You would be required from approximately 10.45am to lpm to help prepare and serve morning tea and lunch.

You may like to help on a regular monthly basis or just occasionally. If you would like to come with a friend, please indicate on the form at the end of this letter.

(b) The Reading Programme. Many of you will have heard of the Reading Mums and Dads. Essentially, these are people who are willing to commit themselves to one hour regularly per week to help a pupil who has reading difficulties. People who have done it, have found it really rewarding. Again, there is a tear-off slip to fill in if you are interested or you could indicate that you would like Ms Illingsworth or Mrs Edwards to ring you and talk the matter over.
