Girls' School Scholarships Application Information for Girls Entering Year 7 in 2019

Scholarship Applications for Year 7 2019 close Wednesday 28 March 2018. All candidates must sit a test on Wednesday 11 April 2018.

The Saint Kentigern Trust Board offers a number of Scholarships for girls wishing to enter Saint Kentigern Girls' School at the Year 7 level in 2019.

The value of the Scholarships is a proportion of the tuition fee for Years 7 and 8 and they range from 25% to 50%. The tenure of the Scholarship is closely monitored, with a full review at the end of each academic year. Should a girl not be committing herself properly to her studies, the Scholarship could be withdrawn.

Candidates for the following Scholarships must be girls who are currently in Year 6 at a New Zealand School. Applicants must be New Zealand citizens or permanent residents.

On receipt of the application form, the candidate's present Principal may be asked to provide a confidential report to the Principal of Saint Kentigern Girls' School.

Year 7 Margaret Lamb Academic Scholarship

The primary consideration in making this award will be a student's performance in the Scholarship exams scheduled on Wednesday 11 April 2018 and after an interview with the Principal of the Girls' School. Only those candidates who do well in the examinations will be invited to attend the interview. All candidates will be informed of the decision of the Scholarship Committee but actual marks will not be given nor will papers be returned. An announcement will be made during Term 2.

Year 7 Margaret Lamb All Round Scholarship

This is awarded to a girl entering Year 7 who displays all-round excellence in academic, sport and/or cultural fields. Candidates applying for the All Round Scholarship must attend the Scholarship examinations scheduled on Wednesday 11 April 2018. A shortlist of candidates will be selected from results gained in the examinations and from information submitted in the initial application form. These girls will be required to attend an interview with the Principal of the Girls' School during Term 2.

Year 7 Margaret Lamb Sport Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to a girl entering Year 7 who displays excellence in one or more sporting fields. Candidates applying for the Sport Scholarship must attend the Scholarship examinations scheduled on Wednesday 11 April 2018. A shortlist of candidates will be selected from information submitted in the initial application form and on results gained in the examinations. These girls will be required to attend an interview with the Principal of the Girls' School during Term 2.

Year 7 Margaret Lamb Music Scholarship

This Scholarship is awarded to a girl entering Year 7 after an audition with the Girls' School Music Director and an interview with the Principal of the Girls' School. Candidates applying for a Music Scholarship must attend the Scholarship examinations scheduled on Wednesday 11 April 2018. Candidates required for auditions will be selected on results gained in the examinations and from information submitted in the initial application form. The audition and interview will take place during Term 2. Candidates will need to show proficiency in one or more instruments. Successful candidates will be expected to perform at Grade 3 level or better on their principal instrument. They will also be expected to take an active part in performance music at the Girls' School.

Year 7 Margaret Lamb Arts Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to a girl entering Year 7 who displays excellence in the performing arts or visual arts fields. Candidates applying for the Arts Scholarship must attend the Scholarship examinations scheduled on Wednesday 11 April 2018. A shortlist of candidates will be selected from information submitted in the initial application form and on results gained in the examinations. These girls will be required to attend an interview with the Principal of the Girls' School during Term 2.

Year 7 Old Collegians' Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to a girl entering Year 7 who displays all-round excellence in academic, sport and/or cultural fields and is the child of an Old Collegian or has a family connection to an Old Collegian. Candidates applying for the Old Collegians' Scholarships must attend the examinations scheduled on Wednesday 11 April 2018. A shortlist of candidates will be selected from results gained in the examinations and from information submitted in the initial application form. These girls will be required to attend an interview with the Principal of the Girls' School along with a representative from the Old Collegians during Term 2.

Conditions and Regulations of Scholarships

- I. Scholarship applications close on Wednesday 28 March 2018. There is no fee payable.
- 2. All candidates for Scholarships will be required to sit Scholarship exams on Wednesday 11 April 2018.
- 3. The subjects for academic examinations are English, Mathematics and Reasoning.
- 4. Scholarships are tenable for two years, provided the Principal is able to give a satisfactory report to the Trust Board at regular intervals of the character, diligence and progress of the scholar. In the case of an unsatisfactory report the Scholarship could be terminated.
- 5. The Scholarship examinations will be overseen and monitored by the Deputy Principal, and the results and her recommendations reported to the Trust Board. In making the award the Trust Board will, in addition to the results of the examination, have regard to the candidate's previous school record and her general bearing and attitude to study, games and discipline. The decision of the Principal is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- 6. The Trust Board reserves the right not to award any or all of the Scholarships offered if the candidates do not reach the required standard.
- 7. Successful candidates will be required to conform to the curriculum, expectations and rules of Saint Kentigern Girls' School.
- 8. Saint Kentigern Girls' School is a Presbyterian Church School and a successful candidate is expected to participate fully and willingly in the Christian aspect of its curriculum.

The examination scripts and the marks awarded will be the property of Saint Kentigern Girls' School. Marks are not forwarded to the candidates.
