Northwest Youth Cricket – 1st XI Cricket Coach

Date: September - December 2023

Purpose:

- Lead, develop & inspire Northwest Cricket Players & Teams focusing (but not limited to) 1stXI Team
- Plan & prepare 1stXI team to perform consistently & successfully each season
- 1stXI Coach will lead the team on and off the field to a high standard of conduct & professionalism enhancing Northwest Cricket values

Key Accountabilities:

- Select teams in conjunction with the Senior Convenor, Team Captain as per selection policy including clear lines of communication with all interested parties (e.g. 2ndXI, Colts XI)
- Schedule and spearhead two team practices per week, design training sessions to target development of individuals along with team development
- Attend and actively lead Northwest 1st XI team to set match day strategy & provide ongoing consultation throughout each match
- Preparing players both physically, mentally and socially so they are ready to perform
- Build a cohesive cricket squad who as a team, display sportsmanship and discipline in their pursuit of success
- Appoint a team captain and team vice-captain or leadership team
- Assist players individually & collaboratively within the team on game strategy development, implementation and execution
- Directly liaise with players on a regular basis regarding their performance progress and/or injury rehabilitation as required
- Clear communication of the program, its expectations and the outcomes desired to players
- Maintain a high level oversight over all performance pathway teams (e.g, 2nd XI, Colts XI) including mentoring players who are likely to progress to higher club honours. 1st XI Coach is encouraged to observe pathways teams matches were possibly & appropriate.
- Work in collaboration with Northwest Committee to establish the best possible coaching and playing environment for our players
- Build a positive, supportive and inclusive team environment that provides for players and administrators enjoyment, success and challenge
- In conjunction with the Northwest Committee, prepare player recruitment strategy and actively recruit players to NWYC
- Assist in providing a pathway for players leaving NWYC cricket into Men's club cricket fit for their future cricketing goals
- Liaise with Grounds Convenor on requirements of practice & match pitches
- Players serious misconduct & disciplinary issues handled appropriately and must be reported to the Northwest Youth Cricket Committee
- Ensure Northwest 1stXI Team including Coaches and Managers abide by NWYC Health & Safety policy

Specific Task Requirements:

- In conjunction with the team manager, roster and communicate to 1st XI players to manage covers (whilst playing at home) in accordance with CMCA 1stXI playing conditions
- Ensure PlayHQ is updated with results after each days play
- Manage team clothing, game day & training equipment including batting nets. Ensure equipment is handled and stored securely to minimise loss or damage.
