RECTOR'S MESSAGE



Welcome to 2018 at TBHS. We've made a good start. The boys have settled back in well. New learning is in progress. The school is alive again with the energy and optimism our young men bring. Co-curricular activity is mounting. And the call has gone out to commit, find new strengths, excel, and to 'stand up and stand out' this year. The new Year 9s are showing positive attitudes and learning habits; taking opportunities to connect to the school and each other, with new peer support leaders assisting. The Powhiri and broader Year 9 induction has encouraged new boys. Our heartfelt thanks go to Te Wera King again for his support of both manuhiri (visitors) and the TBHS tangata whenua. Looking at how Year 9s are handling themselves around the school,

they are a very promising group, and one likely to continue to impress. We also thank parents who have joined us in Year 9 integration, including new BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) development as a special focus.

The House Competition is on the rise. The striking effort boys made at the swimming sports, in and out of the pool, reflected a hearty effort (and rare swimming victory for Dawson on the day!) While we were thrilled to see no fewer than seven school records broken, a truly remarkable feat, praise should also go the way of all boys who swam for their houses in preliminaries the week before, despite many feeling much less confident in the water.

Regarding student leadership, the Student Council, Prefect team, and Thomas House student leaders have all given the year early impetus and purpose. We hope to relaunch the Environmental Group soon too. Student 'voice' with related student action will be part of 2018.

Our school roll remains strong, school spirit is high, we are fully staffed and financially sound, property improvements continue, our teaching practices are developing further, and the overriding goal of lifting each boy effectively remains all - pervasive. Our recently released 2017 NCEA results met, and in places, exceeded national and decile benchmarks across the board. We were delighted for **Hamish Dunbar**, **Ben Aicken**, and **Louis Low**; each awarded a NZQA Scholarship for passing New Zealand's most demanding examinations in Agricultural Science, English and Biology respectively. These three scholars and 99 boys who achieved a Merit or Excellence Endorsement on their NCEA certificate, were celebrated at a special assembly last week. Let's do what we can at home and school to support Year 12s and 13s to keep or advance on their 2017 Endorsement in 2018, and for a new set of NCEA scholars to be Endorsed this year. Successful higher study, strong workplace entry, and personal excellence far beyond school, is fostered by Endorsement.

It's good to be back for another year. Join us in making it a great one for the boys.

Sports News

Records Tumble at TBHS Swimming Sports

Riley Taylor has lowered his own 1500 metres freestyle record with a new mark of 16 minutes 52.8 seconds.

The Year 13 student took 13 seconds off his old record with an impressively controlled swim in the school pool. Year 12 student **Jack Sands** was second in 17 minutes 25 seconds, with Year 11, **Matthew Moore**, 3rd in 18 minutes 36 seconds.

In an outstanding display, **Jack Sands** and **Riley Taylor** erased a combined total of seven records from the history books at the TBHS swimming sports held in ideal conditions at the school pool last Thursday afternoon.

Sands, a Year 12 student, set new marks in the 50 metre freestyle, backstroke, butterfly and breast-stroke while Taylor, a Year 13 student, lowered the times for the 100, 200 and 1500 metre freestyle events. This saw Sands narrowly head Taylor as the Senior Swimming Champion.

The race of the day was undoubtedly the 100 metre freestyle where they went stroke for stroke for all three laps and Taylor edged Sands by the narrowest of margins in a time of 56.9 seconds - well under the previous record of 57.8 seconds set by Taylor last year.

In the Junior section, William Tudgey was Champion and Dominic Coleman was Runner Up.

Sands and Taylor will be looking to continue their good form into the National Championships in April. Dawson, led by Sands, won the Inter-house competition that was quietly, tactfully and impartially compered by Deputy Principal Rod Sparrow.

Otago Boys' High School Exchange

Honours were evenly shared in the traditional Otago Boys'/Timaru Boys' Summer Exchange held in perfect conditions in Dunedin on Monday.

Otago won all three hard fought *Touch Rugby* matches 7-3, 7-4, 8-6.

TBHS dominated the *Senior Tennis* with the team of James Watt, Josh Cameron, George McAleer and Matt Ellis winning all their matches.

Otago won a tight tussle in the *Junior Tennis* while TBHS recorded a pleasing victory in the *Colts Cricket* scoring 109 and dismissing the Year 9 Otago side for 60. I

In the *Cricket 1st XI* encounter played on a difficult wicket of variable pace and bounce, Otago batted first in a one innings declaration fixture and declared at 179-8. **Caleb Donaldson** recorded the best figures with 2-29 off 10 overs. In reply, TBHS could only muster 63 with William Sharp (14) and **McGregor Isbister** (10), the only batsmen to record double figures.

From the Deputy Rector's Desk.....

School Photographs

All students present on that day had individual, vertical form class photographs taken. Year 9 had 'Tree' class photographs and Year 10 their Rite Journey class photographs. Students will be able to order copies of these as well as an ID card with their photograph, date of birth etc. There is no obligation to purchase. Students will be notified when orders can be made.



Vehicle Permission (Senior School)

A reminder that senior students, Year 12 and 13 (Year 11 may bring a moped or similar), must have completed a vehicle permission form before they bring a vehicle to school. These forms are available from the Student Support Office. Passengers are only allowed to be transported if the appropriate documentation has been completed.

BYOD (Bring Your Own Device)

Our aim is to have all Year 9 students by the start of Term 2 this year with a device.

Why are we doing this? "We want to enhance lessons to make great learning even greater with a blending of digital with long-valued teaching and learning techniques. We believe that an internet capable device is now an important part of a boy's modern learning toolkit. It gives them instant access to unlimited resources and enables them to support, extend, communicate and share their learning in ways that prepares them for the future."



Currently we have over 75 Year 9 boys indicating they have a device they can bring to school.

All Year 9 students have had an IT induction programme in their first week and Mr Burke (IT support) is visiting English classes supporting their connection to the school system.

Mr Burke is providing IT support for any student in the second of lunchtime each day.



Office 365

All students are able to download this for free on up to five devices. This can include computers at home. Students have been emailed the details on how to action this.

KAMAR Parent Portal

All parents have been emailed log on details to access this. This has recently been upgraded.



There is a link from the school website or you can have it as a KAMAR app on your phone although some of the material is better accessed on a larger screen.

Parents are able to access: Daily notices, student details, financial, attendance, NCEA summary, results, POWER scores, reports and career pathways. A great way to keep track of your son's progress.


Piano Tutoring
