Inquiry	This term our Inquiry is into <b>Health</b> and <b>Technology</b> . We will be focusing on early Maori health, particularly food, plants for medicinal purposes and the technology involved in gathering, harvesting and storing food. We are also looking into the different dimensions of Hauora (wellbeing). This will be covered in a programme called Pause, Breathe, Smile - which looks at mindfulness by identifying personal strengths, perspectives of wellbeing and acknowledging the strengths and viewpoints of others. Life Education and Harold the Giraffe is with us during Week 1 and 2 with a focus on food, energy, sleep and screen time and how it affects growing bodies.

School opens 8.30am	It is best for students to have time to settle in and be ready for learning by 9.00. The school opens at 8.30 am which allows staff time to prepare for the day before students arrive. If your children need to arrive before 8.30 we ask they wait in the playground or on the balcony until the doors are opened.
Sports	Our focus this term is on Athletics - long jump, high jump, discus, shot put, sprints and long distance. Rakinui will be training each day in preparation for our school athletics day on <b>Tuesday 5 November</b> . More details to come. Please can you make sure your children have suitable sports gear over the next few weeks. It's very difficult to practise high jump in skinny jeans!!!  Some students have committed to <b>Touch Rugby</b> teams after school and thank you to parents who have offered to coach.  Totara students are lucky to be invited to <b>Squash</b> lessons at the Rec centre this term.
PE	Emily continues to work with our students coaching and mentoring their physical education skills. This term she is teaching athletics and small ball skills.
Languages	We continue to develop our Te Reo. Each Thursday morning from 8.50 - 9.30 am Totara continue to receive instruction in Spanish and Japanese from two Cashmere High School teachers; Lylian Carasco and Taka Kuze. We require Totara students to be at school by 8.45 am at the latest on Thursdays in order to be prepared for the lessons.
PB4L	This term we are focussing on Manawanui/ Perseverance, to begin with. We will then be looking at some mindfulness concepts - e.g. feeling grateful. Please look at the school newsletters that are emailed to you every week, on a Friday. There are always articles describing what teaching and learning the school is focussing on.
Health	We continue with teaching <i>Relationship and Sexuality Education</i> this term. This is in conjunction with the Pause, Breathe, Smile programme and Healthy Eating.
Numeracy	The strand focus this term is Algebra, Measurement and Geometry Our number focus will Multiplication and Division. Students continue to work on e-ako on the NZmaths website which allows them to log in at anytime during school or home and work on given material. This is especially good for practising times tables and basic facts knowledge.
Literacy	Our focus for literacy this term is Poetry and Lyric writing. Alongside this focus will be reading material based on our Inquiry topic.

Reports	This is the way you receive 'Reports' for your child, at our school. There are usually 2 curriculum areas reported on each term for your child. We no longer do a summary in the middle or end of the year; instead, we do more frequent and timely updates on your child's progress throughout the year. Please follow the instructions below.
