NETSAFE

On Monday a group of representative students, the senior management team and group of teachers spent parts of the day with the tutor from NETSAFE looking at how we can improve digital safety both at school and in the home. I understand the parent session in the evening was excellent and provided parents with a raft of information to support them with this increasingly challenging issue within society. From a school perspective they have helped us to clarify the conditions of the Harmful Digital Communications Act and how this applies within a school context and have provided us with a very handy self review tool to evaluate how we are going.

Another interesting thing to note is the Helpline and systems Netsafe have as a government appointed entity to help you, the parent, manage issues that happen to your child. The reality is that MOST of the social media issues we encounter happen at home. This leaves parents in a difficult

position as they struggle to understand how to manage these incidents and what if anything, can be done. If you believe the HDCA has been breached, then the correct course of action is the NZ Police. However, a call to NETSAFE will be a great first step in the process to help unpack what is happening and what the correct response may be.

On Sunday a group of Year 12 and 13 students are heading off to the Otago University Open Day in Dunedin with Dr Owens y de Novoa, Mrs Roberts and Mrs Barnes. An additional highlight will be a 3-hour lab session on Sunday afternoon at the Portobello Marine Science facility completing a range of activities that support both Year 12 and 13 Biology standards which the students are studying. There has been a range of experiences packed into this 3-day trip to make the most of the distance being travelled. Thank you to Catherine for organising this and the parents who have offered support to travel or as back up if needed.

We are currently finalising our Course Booklet for 2021 senior subject selection. Already teachers have been talking to students about courses to assist them to make informed decisions at selection time. On Wednesday 19th we are having a 'speed dating' type event in the Gym in Period 5 for next year's senior students with information on courses and the selection process.

This week at assembly we were reacquainted with one of our school values – Integrity - which will be a focus for the Term. One of the best definitions I believe that describes Integrity is 'doing the right thing even when no-one is watching'. As we move towards a future of great uncertainty, the values we hold and demonstrate will become an important point of difference between people and will certainly contribute towards our ability to be resilient in the face of change and help our future success.

AF8 Emergency Preparedness Scenario

Hope all is well. The science tells us that a rupture of the Alpine Fault is inevitable and typically happens every 300 years or so. The last time it ruptured was 1717... 303 years ago. In 2016, in the aftermath of the Kaikoura Earthquake the disruption to day to day life because of infrastructure damage like State Highway 1 was significant and still ongoing... What would a magnitude 8+ earthquake do to the Hurunui? What will we do? How long for?

The Boyle is planning an Emergency Preparedness Scenario for the 2nd of October (middle Friday of the school holidays). When we started looking at this, we realised that this could be really beneficial for the community as a whole and want to extend the option of participation for Amuri Area School as participants i.e. Group members out doing activities on the day. We are looking for about 30 -40 student participants. The aim is to refine our emergency procedures while creating more resilience in our people. That way when the fault inevitably ruptures (hopefully not for a very long time) we or our successors will be better prepared. A simultaneous scenario will also be run in Hanmer Springs in conjunction with local Police, CD, Red Cross Response Team, and FENZ. A good time to test the districts systems and response.
