- Course: STAT101
- Orientation: 6 January 2021
- Start date: 7 January 2021
- End date: 10 February 2021
- UC credits: 15 points
- 12 hours per week of Statistics, including classes and tutorials. 2 hours per week of Academic Skills workshop.
- Successful completion will be determined through a variety of methods such as skills tests, assignments and final exam.
- Summer Bridging Programme Fee: \$4750 (GST inclusive)

Statistics is used in many subjects including Engineering, Physics, Data Science, Psychology, Forestry, Science, Geography, and Management. STAT101 is a required course for UC's Bachelor of Commerce and Bachelor of Science degrees.
