At this time of the year we look at some statistics: how many people regularly look at Ko Te Tonga kei te Karaka - The South Calling articles and watch YouTube video clips. What were the highlights for 2024?

Ko Te Tonga kei te Karaka:

Over 2024, 32 issues were produced (plus one extra for clergy only), with most viewed Publications being:

- 1. 5 December 2024 (1083 views) (The Ven Anne van Gend Bishop Elect)
- 2. Special Edition 1 February 2024 (776 views) (Bishop Steve's resignation)
- 3. 3 October 2024 (421 views) (headlined Lumsden closure)
- 4. 19 December 2024 (282 views) (final edition for 2024)

For the overall newsletter, readership in 2024 was 10,524 with an average of 329 per issue. There has been a definite uptake in readership over the past three years with current subscribers sitting at 544.

Nourishing Faith

Nourishing Faith (the main portal to Gospel Conversations) was the most viewed article in the newsletter as this is regularly updated each week (so has a cumulative total) and is sent out to a seperate mailing list. **Over the past year this was viewed 6881 times.**

From February to Christmas 2024, 51 Gospel Conversation videos were published via Nourishing Faith with a total viewership of 8808 (5863 in 2023). The biggest "hit" was 317 views for the <u>December 1</u> <u>Advent 1 edition</u>. There was an average of 173 views taking place each video (113 in 2023).

Important Dates for your calendars

Some dates to note during a typical year: deadlines for Synod, returns to the Diocesan office and other useful reminders for your faith community.

Important dates and Reminders

We have some general reminders that Vestries, Church Committees, Chapters and other leadership groups can refer to to help keep on top of everything you need to report on or respond to.

The following summary is attached below to print and refer to.

The list below is not comprehensive and will be added to when we hear of anything that needs to be on here - please contact the Diocesan Registrar <u>registrar@calledsouth.org.nz</u> with any suggestions, and we will add them to future versions.

We suggest that some of these may be "standing agenda items" on governance body agendas Standing Agenda Items:

- **Contingency Plan** see <u>Contingency Plan</u> for a template you can use. What will you do if key people in your community are no longer able to fulfil other duties?
- Leases for facilities, house leases that are not registered with the DDTB. Make a note to review these and what month work needs to start on this. Agenda this for the first meeting of your year.
- **Health and Safety** a standing agenda item. Any major concerns, accidents-incidents or near misses? Any regular training that needs to take place?
- **Safeguarding and complaints** a standing agenda item. Safeguarding training and audits will be advised during the year.
- **Revaluations of Properties are due every three years** contact Diocesan Accountant for what is required around this.

- Annual Inspections of property held by faith community, including vicarages schedule these in, you may want to use the annual Loss Prevention Audit (see June prompt below) as an opportunity to do this, see also the website https://www.calledsouth.org.nz/health-safety/.
 Section G of the handbook has other additional information that may be helpful, including Number 4 (Vicarages, Deaneries and other Faith Community Houses)
 Section 12i Vicarage or Church House Checklist.
- Annual Review of Terriers schedule your Terrier to be reviewed during the year, with any
 additions or subtractions noted. Please send any updated information to the Registrar in the
 Diocesan Office. See <u>Terrier (Church Property Register) Template</u> a useful document for
 taking an inventory. Contact the Registrar for information for when you last submitted this.
- **Clergy Matters** Clergy Licence requirements are dealt with directly from the Bishop's office, on an individual basis, as they fall due. Lay Minister Licence renewal occurs triennially next due Pentecost 2025. Licensing outside of that can be requested via the Bishop's office.





- We have an order of service that can be used every month (attached below).
- Hymns and readings for each service are also attached below (these are updated each month).

Who can join us for any of our services?

Any group (or individual) who can gather around a screen!

- In places where church services are only occasional, maybe two or three of you could meet together in someone's home and join us from there.
- Faith communities who don't "need" this but are open to trying something new may like to join us to support smaller groups. (Alexandra is an example of this).
- Ministry teams of small churches may simply like a week off from finding a priest and filling a
 roster.
- **Individuals** who, for whatever reason, cannot attend a regular service are also welcome to join us and share in spiritual communion if we cannot get the reserved sacrament to you.

If you let us know in advance, we can ensure reserved sacrament gets to any small gathering. If you are wanting to meet in your own church, Anne van Gend can work with you to provide and set up whatever equipment and internet connection is needed.

Please contact Anne van Gend by **email** or phone 0272647245 (please do not leave a voice message).

This is not meant to be a plan to replace communal, in-person worship, but is offering an alternative to both assist some who can gather together but lack a preacher or priest, and for those unable to meet with others.

Why Do this?

This is part of our ongoing commitment to find ways to support and minister with all those across our Diocese, with services planned for the 4th Sunday of each month. We are all aware that there are communities and individuals across our Diocese for whom running or attending a Sunday service can be difficult. There are the regular issues of finding a priest, filling a roster, overcoming distances, being ill/needing to stay at home and so on.

Services are using Reserved Sacrament in various physical locations from Invercargill and Dunedin to Lumsden, Alexandra and Palmerston, with smaller groups and individuals being given an opportunity to take part in a moment of Spiritual Communion.


Please mark Saturday 29th March 2025 in your diary and let others in your congregations know this.





Others are also welcome to attend, subject to spaces being available. *Please see the attached Diocesan 'Expectations in Ministry'*.

Lay Ministers:

It is an essential requirement to ensure that you have attended a Boundaries Workshop within the last three years if you wish to be re-licensed or are being Licensed for the first time with a Lay Licence. Current Lay Minister Licences expire at Pentecost 2025 and attendance at one of the sessions before Pentecost is necessary if you wish to be licensed.

Clergy:

All Clergy undertaking ministry, whether full time, part time, or on occasion, have an obligation to protect all who we minister to and amongst.

It is a requirement that all Clergy with a PTO or Licence attend a Boundaries Workshop every three years, as a minimum. If you haven't attended a course in the last three years, you will need to ensure you attend one of these sessions so that your Licence or PTO is able to remain current or be renewed.

Pilgrims and Companions Journeying into 2025

Anne van Gend — October 23rd, 2024

Over 70 people have taken part in the Bishop's Companions Programme since it began. Now we're taking on names for 2025, with a cut-off date of 30 November.

The experience has been different for every participant, as it was meant to be. It has also been one of deepening faith and deepening companionship, as we hoped it would be. It is wonderful to see God working through the simplicity of this programme.

The best way of finding out what the BCP involves and can offer is to talk with one of the Pilgrims or Companions who have been part of it over the past 3 years. They would be delighted to tell you about it, and I think, without exception, would urge you to think and pray about taking part.

Pilgrims come to this Programme needing nothing but themselves, just as they are, and wherever they are in their faith-life. There are no expectations in terms of knowledge or spirituality or experience. There isn't even any prior reading assigned! God is drawing each of us on a faith-journey already, but sometimes it can be helpful to have an extra incentive to keep stepping forward; sometimes it can be good to have someone beside you as you choose directions; sometimes it can be helpful to pore over a map with a fellow-walker. The BCP is designed for all those things. As a Pilgrim, you will have a Companion come alongside you and match their steps and speed to yours, keeping you company as you walk deeper into the Light.

For Companions – those asked to walk alongside the Pilgrims – there's a bit more preparation needed. For some, there are practicalities such as the whole world of planning and running Zoom conversations to get our heads around! For others, preparation involves finding 20 minutes to half an hour that can be committed and dedicated to their Pilgrim every week. For all of us there is always more to learn about walking alongside people in their journey of faith.

This is a significant thing to be happening across our Diocese. It is not flashy or complicated; it is not a quick-fix for anything. What it is, is a recognition that everything of worth and depth and beauty in our lives is from God. It is a recognition that if we are to see ourselves and our world transformed, it can only happen when our lives are rooted deeply in prayer, the Scriptures, and the imitation of Christ.

And it is an act of faith. Here we are, God. Take us, shape us, make us into Your Kingdom people.

We have the only university-based theology programme in New Zealand right here in Dunedin. Have a look at the courses on offer in 2025.

The Programme offers a huge range of papers, but Paul Treblico, who heads up the Theology Programme, writes:

"I wanted to draw your attention to some papers in particular. We are offering a paper on *Trauma-Informed Ministry* (PAST 307/MINS 405), to be taught by Dr Karen McClintock. This is a Semester 1 paper with a block course from 27-31 January in Dunedin (a flyer is attached). All the teaching is during the block course/ intensive, with assessment to follow during the Semester.


