

A reminder that our Amuri value for this term is 'Self Discipline.' This is a quality that is useful in all contexts in life whether it be study, sport, hobbies or work. When we develop good self-discipline, it becomes an asset that can be used to achieve success. There are many parts to self-discipline. In the school context this can look like being prepared or organised, meeting deadlines and keeping our attention and focus on the tasks that are in front of us. I encourage you to have conversations with your children about this important value and how they might display self-discipline at both school and at home.

Bus reminders: If your child catches the school bus could you please ensure they are ready at the collection point at least 5 minutes prior to the scheduled arrival time of the bus. This will help ensure that they don't miss the bus. In many cases it is difficult and unsafe for the bus to turn back or reverse to collect children who may have missed the bus passing. Please also remind older students to let the younger students on first.

Primary School News Kia ora Parents and Whanau

Welcome back to Term 3. We know that this term can be the most challenging for some of our school whanau and we wish those who are starting the busy calving and lambing season all the best for this! A reminder that we have the food warmer that can heat lunches for children. Please ensure all lunches are well wrapped in foil and are clearly named. The school canteen is also available daily and the order forms are located by the orders box in the primary breakout space.

This term we in Year 1-6 we are teaching 'Keeping Ourselves Safe'. This is a Health unit we teaching to all children every two years. The unit is designed to teach children about keeping themselves safe in different situations. Class teachers and/or classroom release teachers will be teaching the unit. P please ask your class teacher who will be teaching this unit to your child.

The children will learn

- · to work out when their safety is at risk
- how to keep safe when they meet and mix with other people
- who and how to ask for help if they, or some one they know, is being abused
- to go on asking for help until someone does something to stop the abuse
- that it is important to make and follow personal, family and school safety rules

They will know:

- that abuse is never okay
- · that abuse is never their fault


