TBHS Rowing - an Exceptional Team!!

Timaru Boys' High School ended the 2021 Rocket Foods New Zealand Rowing Championships at Lake Ruataniwha with an impressive five national titles and two bronze medals

Our TBHS crews had made eleven A finals and three B finals.

This provided a rewarding end to a week that started with the nervous reality that the event may not be able to go ahead because of the need for Covid 19 restrictions. By Thursday, racing could proceed.

The men's novice coxed four (Josh Bartlett, Ben Williamson, Ben Allan, Blake Parker, coxed by **Tim Bartlett**) started the medal haul off by winning Bronze.

Sam Wilson and William Talbot won Gold in the men's intermediate double sculls.

In an exciting string of races, Timaru Boys' High School raced in three final events in a row that resulted in three podium finishes.

Our Men;s novice double sculls of Josh Bartlett and Blake Parker won Bronze.

This was followed by **Billy McCully, Will Davidson, William Light, Sam Wilson** and cox **Tim Bartlett** win the National title for the Men's Intermediate Coxed Four.

Then came the Men's Club Single Sculls in which **Hamish Yeatman** won a well deserved Gold medal.

Sam Wilson, William Talbot, Will Davidson, Billy McCully and coxswain **Ty Bishop** won the national title for Men's Intermediate Coxed Quad Sculls.

The final Gold won for TBHS was in the Men's Novice Coxed Quad, in which **Josh Bartlett, Ben Allen, Mac Brown, Blake Parker** and cox **Ty Bishop** raced.

Timaru Club rowers (ex TBHS rowers) **Hooper Kelly-Smith, Liam Parker and Seb Van den Bosch**, along with **Cam Moffat**, won Bronze in the Mens Club Coxless Quad Sculls.

Head Coach **Brian Smith**, and **Hooper Kelly-Smith** were coaching our boys at Ruataniwha this week. They, along with coaches **Jaimee Harrison** and **Andy Walton-Woodings**, have continued to prepare for the South Island Secondary Schools event to be held at Lake Ruataniwha (now cancelled) and Maadi at Lake Karapiro in March (dependent upon Covid restrictions!)

2020 Teschemaker Cup Recipient


Congratulations to Professor Nigel McMIllan, recipient of the 2020 Teschemaker Cup.

The Teschemaker Cup is awarded annually by the THS Old Boys' Association and recognises "an outstanding Old Boy who has achieved national or international prominence in the area of sport, cultural activities, research, business or public affairs".

Prof McMillan is a cancer researcher interested in the infectious causes of cancer.

He is an internationally recognised expert in the area of human papillomavirus, gene editing and gene silencing with over 90 publications and has had continuous NHRMC funding for 22 years.

Research findings:



- discovered how HPV signals cells to replicate better
- found 3 new papillomaviruses in Australian wildlife, including one in echidnas
- found HPV is present in normal blood, explaining why researchers find it in lots of cancers
- developed novel liposomes for drug delivery
- showed silencing of the HPV E7 gene caused tumours to shrink
- first to show cancer can be eliminated completely using CRISPR

We look forward to celebrating the award with Professor McMillan at a special presentation to be made later in the year.



TBHS Multisport Team

Optimistically anticipating a change to Covid Alert Level 2 for a secondary schools' triathlon on Thursday 18 March, the TBHS team was pleasantly surprised to see a drop to Level 1 which enabled the event to run.

The individual boys' event saw our team swim 400m, cycle 10km and run 3.5km in 28 degree heat, in fields of about 40 competitors in each grade. Our best placing was **Payo**

O'Sullivan who came3rd in the U14 boys section.

Friday was rest day, and the boys enjoyed go-karting around the Highland Motorsport Park, where **Reef Roberts** showed his skill behind the wheel with the best lap time.

Saturday's ½ Ironman event was our team entry, where **Thomas Kyle** swam the 1.9km lake swim, **Roberts** and **Benson Arnold** cycled the 90kms, and our runners **Malachy Cleland** and **Josh Young** completed the last leg of 21 km in the heat of the day. We completed all this in 5 hrs, 6 mins for a credible 6th place in our section that included all schools and corporate teams combined.

Timaru Dominate Annual Summer Waitaki Exchange

Timaru played host to this year's Waitaki interschool exchange on Tuesday 2 March in splendid warm conditions.

The **1st XI** continued their good recent form with what was a comfortable seven wicket win over their Waitaki counterparts in a 50 over match. Batting first, Waitaki were eventually dismissed for 212 after a strong start. Best of the

TBHS bowlers were **Caleb Donaldson** 3-34 and **Jayden Williams** 3-35 although Timaru will be a bit disappointed with a shoddy fielding display. Waitaki had a glimmer of hope when **Toby Clemett** was dismissed for 39 but an unbroken stand for the 4th wicket between the in form pair of Donaldson 59 not out and **Fletcher Rhodes** 52 not out saw TBHS cruise to the win with several overs to spare.

In the **2nd XI** match at Ashbury Park, Timaru batted first in a 40 over contest and led by a half century to **Tom Allan**, compiled a competitive 181. In reply, Waitaki were dismissed for 110 with the wickets shared amongst the Timaru bowlers.

TBHS had too much depth for Waitaki in the **Tennis** and recorded a comfortable 5-1 win with only Waitaki's talented number one recording a win in his singles match.

The **Golf** at the Timaru Golf Club at Levels saw **Daniel Poulter**, **Ryan Caldwell** and **Damon Johnston** all record victories while **Josh Rees** did well to halve his match with Waitaki's number one who shot a 74 gross off a 3 handicap for a net 71. This saw TBHS record a three and a half to a half win

The **Senior Touch** saw three even contests with Timaru coming back from an opening 2-1 defeat to win the next two fixtures 3-0 and 3-1, winning overall 2-1 in a match up that doubled as an Aoraki regional final.

Waitaki recorded a decisive win in the **Volleyball**, with their strong, athletic side not losing a set in a 3-0 win. They also prevailed 4-2 in the **Croquet**, while Timaru won the **Bowls** to record a 6-2 win overall in the exchange.



Quigley claims Eight Titles at TBHS Athletic Sports

Year 10 student **Bill Quigley** claimed a possibly unprecedented eight individual titles at the Timaru Boys' High School Athletics Sports held on Tuesday the 23rd of February in good conditions at Aorangi Stadium.

Quigley was totally dominant in the Minor grade taking out the 100, 200, 400 metres and 80 metre Hurdles events on

the track. He also added a quartet of field titles in the discus, shot-put, long-jump and javelin.

The Junior division titles were more evenly spread with **Baxter Mason** (800,1500 and 3000 metres) dominating the distance events. **Mac Faalupega** (100/200 metres), **Cale Tompkins** (high jump/javelin) and **Tom Geary** (400 metres/hurdles) all took home two titles apiece.

Saxon McNoe was the dominant athlete in the Intermediate division claiming the 400/800 Metre double on the track as well as titles in the discus, triple jump and high jump.

In the Senior Grade, the sprinting of **Joeli Vinakadina** was a real highlight as he took out the Senior 100 metres in 11.4 seconds and the 200 metre title as well as the Champion of Champions race in a slick time of 11.3 seconds. An injury to **Jed Syme** robbed the meet of an intriguing match up on the track. Vinakadina also took out the Senior long jump title. In the distance events, **Charlie Clemens** took the 800, 1500 and 3000 metre titles.

SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship provides recognition and monetary reward to top students in their last year of schooling. Scholarship examinations enable candidates to be assessed against challenging standards and are demanding for the most able candidates in each subject.

Scholarship candidates are expected to demonstrate high-level critical thinking, abstraction and generalisation, and to integrate, synthesise and apply knowledge, skills, understanding and ideas to complex situations.

Approximately three per cent of Year 13 students studying each subject at Level 3 are awarded Scholarship if they reach the standard that has been set.

In 2020 there was one Year 13 student who achieved three Scholarships. He also receives an Academic Colour for 2020.




National Youth Drama School Congratulations
