#### **Message From The Principal**

Recently there has been considerable media coverage over the level of sickness of schools' staff and how schools are attempting to cope with this challenge.

There are two main areas that have caused absence over this last term. These are: COVID, with either staff testing positive or being a household contact, or having to look after sick children. Then we have the winter colds and flu viruses which have returned this



year with a vengeance now that everyone is no longer in lock downs at home. There is also a nasty gastro bug in circulation. We had a week this term where we were sixteen to eighteen teachers

down for the entire week. We have about eight relievers on our books, but some of them are unavailable on certain days or fall ill themselves. We do the best we can to avoid rostering home a year level at a time.

However, on three occasions, we have found this necessary in order to keep our classes running with teachers available.

The holiday break should provide a circuit breaker for everyone's health but then Term Three will be frantic, especially for our seniors who need to have completed their internal assessments during this coming term.

The parent who justifies an absence without a valid reason may blame teachers and our College when their child doesn't achieve in NCEA.
