Season Preview



The King's Lions' Rugby Club is up and running again in our 86th year.

The focus of our rugby club continues to concentrate on two main missions;

- a) Encourage our young men to continue in rugby through and afterschool
- b) Inspire and educate those young men who seek a career in rugby.

The most important components to achieve these two missions are to give our lions' the best opportunity to succeed by coaching them well and working with them to create an environment they have a strong connection with.

This is achieved by instilling the behaviours of a RAIONA (Lion);

ATTACKING - Style
BRAVE - Mindset
PROTECTIVE - Culture
We before me - Choice

What is also significant about King's Lions' Rugby is the number of Old Boys who are now giving back through coaching and managing. In 2022 we will have 12 KHS old boys in team coaching positions and another five involved with team management and specialist coaching.

In 2022 King's Lions' Rugby will put out eight teams comprising of 190 players which is a 12 % increase on 2021.

We have also made some adjustments to our rugby programme based on our 2021 season review in which all players and parents/caregivers were encouraged to take part. These adjustments are detailed later in this newsletter.

I would like to thank our coaches and managers who make our club function so well and wish you and your teams all the best for the 2022 season.




2021 Review


At the conclusion of the 2021 season King's Lions' Rugby Club conducted a review of our current programme.

The results are outlined below:



Did you feel connected through our RAIONA behaviours and team environments?




King's Lions' Coaching Philosophy follows a process geared towards continual improvement of the team and individual. Do you believe you have improved as a rugby player this year?

Adjustments - based on Review



- a) Panthers
- b) Development
- c) Tigers

The reason for this adjustment in our junior programme is to create a stronger culture in all of our Saturday teams by promoting leadership opportunities and a stronger connection to those players they share the field with on a Saturday. Like our previous model, there is still the opportunity for movement between these training squads.

The Panthers and Development will train together on a Tuesday and then our Tigers and Panthers teams will be selected before Thursday's training.

The Development players will be given action plans to assist in their development to reach the Panthers.

2) Position/Role Specific Coaching sessions

We have identified that our players require more position/role specific development sessions using specialist resource coaching. In 2022 we are aiming to achieve two of these sessions for our junior teams.

3) Alignment

To add more depth to our senior rugby programme. We have created alignment within our 1st XV, 2nd XV, U15 Panthers and U14 Panthers environments. This alignment has been created via;

- a) Coaching resource support (larger coaching and management teams)
- b) King's playing identity
- c) RAIONA behavioural accountability.

We have also included a development group of players who have ambition and potential to progress into 2nd XV and 1st XV rugby during their senior years at King's.
